However, Acton regained a four goal margin less than a minute later when Hepburn put the puck past a sprawling Raider goalie for his fourth goal of the night on a pass from Will Moorehouse and Greaves.

Shane Drexler then hit the twine for Acton on a breakaway a minute before Moorehouse beat the Raider goalie with a blueline blast, assisted by Matt Wolfer and T. Chapman, to end the second period up 8-1.

The Galvcast Midgets continued their strong team play in the third period with T. Chapman and Greaves setting Drexler up midway through the period. A charged Drexler then scored his hat trick on a pass out from beside the net by Hepburn and Sheehan. While down, the Georgetown team did not give up, scoring on a late period breakaway to end the game 10-2.

Prior to this victory Acton suffered four consecutive losses. In Dundas, the Tanners played a strong first period and led the game 3-1.

Ryan Lindo opened the Tanner scoring midway through the first, assisted by Wolfer and Hepburn, while Atkinson potted the second goal shortly after on a setup from Tyler Thompson. Dundas reduced the Acton margin before Thompson struck with a goal of his own from Atkinson and Wolfer.

Acton collapsed in the second period, allowing Dundas to score 5 goals to Acton's loan marker scored by Wolfer from Thompson. Dundas scored two additional goals in the third to defeat Acton 8-4.

The Tanners continued their lacklustre play against Hespeler Shamrocks. While no scoring occurred during the first period, Hespeler had the distinct advantage with only Ian Boileau's efforts in net blanking the Shamrocks. Hespeler was not to be denied scoring five unanswered goals, with Acton looking on in the second period.

The Tanners gained some respect in the third period. Finding the Hespeler net were Greaves from Thompson and Wolfer, and Mike McDonald assisted by Greaves and

Wolfer on the power play. Hespeler beat Boileau late in the third to win 6-2.

The Midgets faced a fired up Milton Winterhawk team, in Milton, smarting from a previous loss to the Tanners. Milton came out flying and scored three goals in each of the first two periods before Acton was able to respond with a single of their own in the third (Thompson from McDonald), to end the game 6-1.

The fourth loss came at home against the Arthur Vipers. Acton spotted Arthur a five goal lead before Thompson (Wolfer and Atkinson) scored with less than a minute remaining in the second period. The Acton play picked up in the third with Atkinson scoring early in the third from Wolfer and Ward. Moorehouse (Greaves) then reduced the Viper margin to three, scoring on the power play. However, Arthur held the rejuvenated Acton attackers off for the remainder of the period and scored one of their own with less than a minute remaining to win 6-3.

Basement-Entry Design

Most homeowners appreciate an abundance of light in the house and this basement-entry home fulfills that desire perfectly.

The many windows make sure that plenty of natural light is allowed to stream into the house and at the same time add to the design appeal of the exterior.

A good-sized den, located immediately off the foyer, is ideally placed to serve as a home office. So many people work from their homes these days, this room is in the right location to meet business visitors, who are able to step right into the office without having to walk through the house.

A box-window at the top of the stairs adds light to the landing area and a plant shelf gives the space an added appeal.

The three bedrooms occupy the front of the house, with the master bathroom includes a soaker tub set into a bay and a walk-in closet.

Bedrooms two and three share a three-piece bathroom. In the living areas at the rear of the house, the large living room and dining area are open to one another to create one large room that gives the feeling of even more space.

French doors from each of these rooms lead outside to a sun deck off the living room and a covered deck off the dining room. It's easy to imagine the covered deck being used as an extension of the dining room for outdoor meals during the warmer months.

The U-shaped kitchen is open to the dining/living rooms to enable the cook to prepare meals without being cut off from family or guests.

The kitchen is a dream of efficiency, with a walk-in pantry and plenty of countertop space.

Broom and linen cupboards and a washer and dryer complete the main floor layout.

The unfinished basement is ideal for those who want to expand their living space. Alternatively, this area could be used for an additional suite where local by-laws allow this.

The double garage has a side door as well as access to the house through the basement hallway.

The house is 38 feet wide and 42 feet deep with 1,353 sq ft of living space as well as the unfinished basement area.
