

Four teams compete at Tanner Christmas tourney

Acton Minor Novice Tanners hosted a one-day tournament on December 27, with the teams in the tournament including the Acton Novice Select Team, Erin and Hespeler.

The Tanners started out against Hespeler, and lost 4-2. Acton's first goal came on a rush by Nicholas Eagan, assisted by Jake Lewis. Acton's second goal also came on an Eagan shot, but this time the goalie stopped it, but John White fired the rebound into the net for his first goal of the season. Chris Chiasson also assisted on the goal. Goalie Jesse Harris shut Hespeler out for his half game. Next up for the Tanners was Erin, who beat them 6-0.

The Novice Select Team also played Hespeler and Erin, and they lost also. In their first game, the Selects took on Hespeler and lost 5 -0. Erin then beat the Selects 12-1. The Selects' Goal was scored by Lauren Vermeulen, assisted by Taylor Buchanan and Rachel Kirkwood in the 2nd period.

Before the playoffs, some of the players participated in a skills competition. The first event was the team relay, with the Selects starting off against Erin. The Selects team was Dylan Britton, Christopher Rachel Azzopardi, Kirkwood, Kayley Kearns and goalie Cody Fram. Unfortunately, Erin was faster, and won to advance to the finals.

Next was the Tanners against Hespeler, and the Tanner team of Jesse Spurrell, Nicholas Eagan, Brandan Lockyer, Roger Kirkness and goalie Zachery Payne won to advance to the final, where they lost to Erin.

The next event was the shooting contest, with a goalie and a player from each team. The Selects sent out goalie Nicholas Victoria and shooter Nathan Bennett. The Tanners team was goalie Jesse Harris and shooter Jake Lewis. Each goalie faced each shooter for three shots, and when the results were totalled, the finals matched Acton goalies Nicholas Victoria

and Jesse Harris against the Erin and Hespeler shooters. Each shooter had five shots on each goalie, and the winners were goalie Jesse Harris of the Tanners, and shooter Steven Borg of Erin.

The consolation silver medal final matched the Tanners and the Selects for the championship of Acton. The Tanners scored first as Jesse Spurrell carried the puck in and scored, with assists going to Danielle Cooper and Chris Chiasson. The Tanners second goal was scored on a rush by Nicholas Eagan, unassisted. The Tanners scored again when Jake Lewis' shot from the point was stopped by the Select goalie, but Brandan Lockyer was there to drive in the rebound. The Selects then scored to get back in the game, as Dayne Black scored off a Tanner defender, from Christopher Azzopardi. The Tanners answered back with two goals of their own. First Dylan Cremona fired a shot that was stopped, but John White was there to score on the rebound, with his second goal of the tournament. The final Tanner goal was scored on a rush by Roger Kirkness, assisted by Chris Chiasson, and Basil Payne, who picked up his first point of the sea-

The tournament gold medal final matched Erin and Hespeler, and it was the game of the tournament. The teams traded long-range goals to make the score 2-2 after regulation time. After the games tournament organizer Charlie Payne presented the players with their medals. All the Tanner parents who helped with the day worked hard and deserve credit for hosting a successful tournament.

The Novice Select team played well in the opening periods of its first two tournament games, but lost their drive towards the end of each game and had to settle for a 5-0 loss to Hespeler and a 12-1 loss to Erin. In the consolation final the Select team was downed 5-3 by the Novice Tanners.

Tournament co-ordinator Charlie Payne said the team started strong in each game.

"It was par hockey, but the Selects weren't a dominant team," Payne said, adding they showed great sportsman-

The tournament normally runs for three days with a different division running each day, but this year only the Novice team was able to rally enough people to stage the event.

"We had no problems and I want to thank all of the sponsors that helped make it happen, along with all of the parent volunteers who made it easy," Payne said.

In pool play, Lauren Vermeulen scored the Selects' lone goal in a 12-1 loss to Erin. Taylor Buchanan and Rachel Kirkwood had assists.

The Novice Tanners scored three goals but held the Novice Select team scoreless through the first two periods of the consolation.

At the top of the third period Nathan Bennett scored his first goal of the game with help from Chris Azzopardi to make it 3-1.
