s for seniors on avoiding winter falls

Winter is a hazardous time for anyone who walks outdoors, but especially for Seniors. Slippery roads, snow and ice, and cold temperatures create unsafe conditions that can lead to a fall.

Poor balance, arthritis in the knees and poor vision, combined with boots with worn soles and icy sidewalks can all work together to cause slips and trips for an older person.

Here are some tips for Seniors to help stop a winter fall before it happens:

1. Wear well-fitting boots and overshoes with a deep tread.

2. If you use a cane, attach an ice pick to it.

3. Keep all walkways and steps clear of snow and ice. Have a shovel and ice melter on hand.

4. Watch out for ice when you are walking ... wearing sunglasses can reduce glare.

5. If you must walk on

ice, slow down and take small

6. When using stairs, hold on to the railing.

7. Carry parcels by your side so you can watch your step.

8. Take a taxi home from a shopping trip when conditions are unsafe. The money you spend is well worth it if you avoid falling and hurting yourself.

9. If your balance is not good, stay indoors on icy days. Be active inside your home and wait until the weather improves.




