

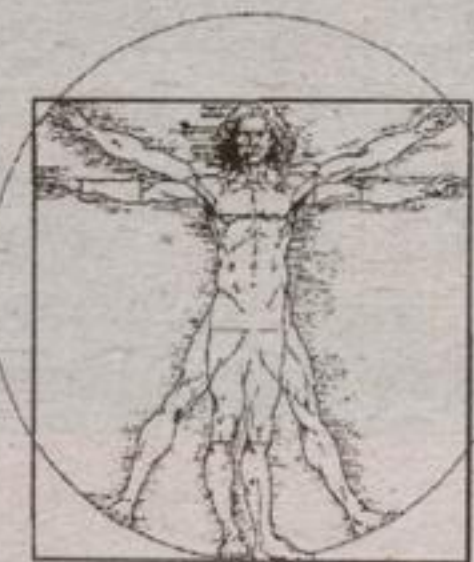

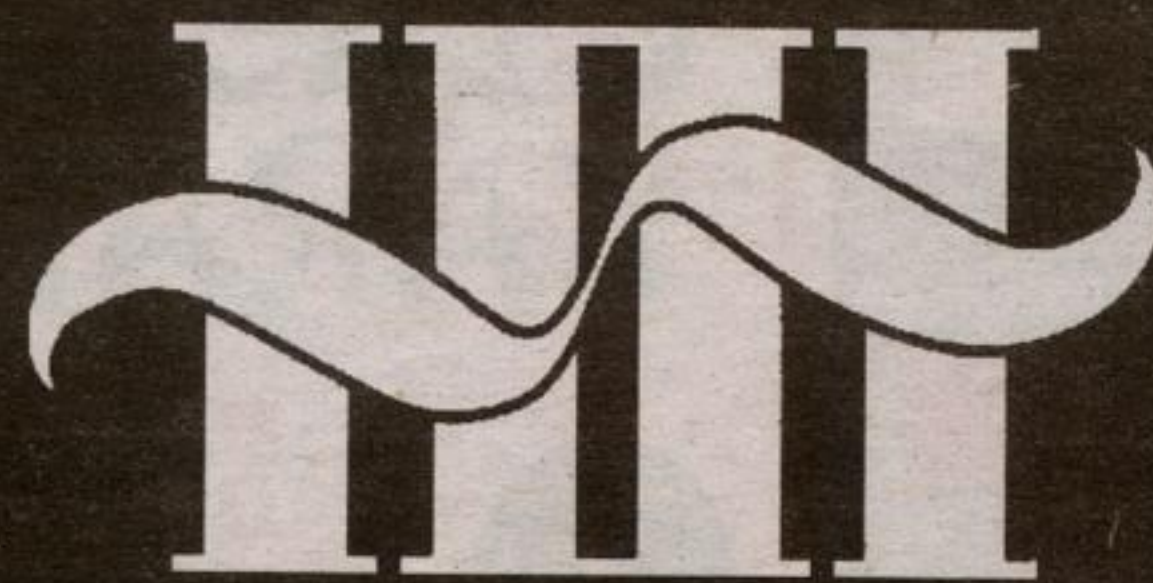

NOTICE OF A PUBLIC MEETING

WARD 1/Part of Lot 29 Concession 3, Lots 1 and 11 - Registered Plan 20M-576 and Lots 1-60 inclusive, Block 61-64 inclusive - Registered Plan 20M-753 File: D14-Acto-2 Investments Limited

General committee for the Town of Halton Hills will conduct a Public Meeting to examine and discuss a proposed amendment to the Acton Zoning by-law No. 1358, as previously amended by by-law 95-97 and by-law 92-62. This Zoning by-law Amendment application relates to **all** Registered and Proposed developable Lots and Blocks located within by-law 95-97 (including Lots 1-60, and Blocks 61, 62, 63, and 64, Registered Plan 20M-573) and **Lot 1** and **Lot 11** in Zoning by-law 92-62 as shown in Registered Plan 20M-576. The specific Lots and Blocks affected by this Zoning by-law Amendment application are shown within two (2) Registered Plans of Subdivision and a Draft Approved Subdivision, Regional File: 24T-90024 in the Community of Acton as described above and shown on the attached map. The subject lands are generally located west of Churchill Road, north of McDonald Boulevard.

The purpose of the proposed Zoning by-law Amendment is to permit the construction of bungalows on the above noted Lots and Blocks. Although the zoning for the subject lands currently permits the construction of bungalows, the maximum building lot coverage for the affected Lots and Blocks is less than that required by the applicant. The applicant has requested a maximum building lot coverage of 45% for all interior building lots and maximum building lot coverage of 40% for all exterior building lots. The applicant's requested building lot coverages represent an increase from between 5 to 15% for the interior building lots and 6 to 10% for the exterior building lots.

If you wish to be notified of the adoption of the proposed Zoning by-law Amendment and/or if you wish to be notified of the decision of the Town of Halton Hills in respect of this proposed Zoning by-law, you

must make a written request to the Town of Halton Hills at 1 Halton Hills Drive, Georgetown, Ontario L7G 5G2.

If a person or public body that files a notice of appeal of a decision of the Town of Halton Hills in respect of the proposed Zoning by-law does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or

make written submissions to the Town of Halton Hills before the proposed Zoning by-law Amendment is adopted, the Ontario Municipal Board may dismiss all or part of the appeal.

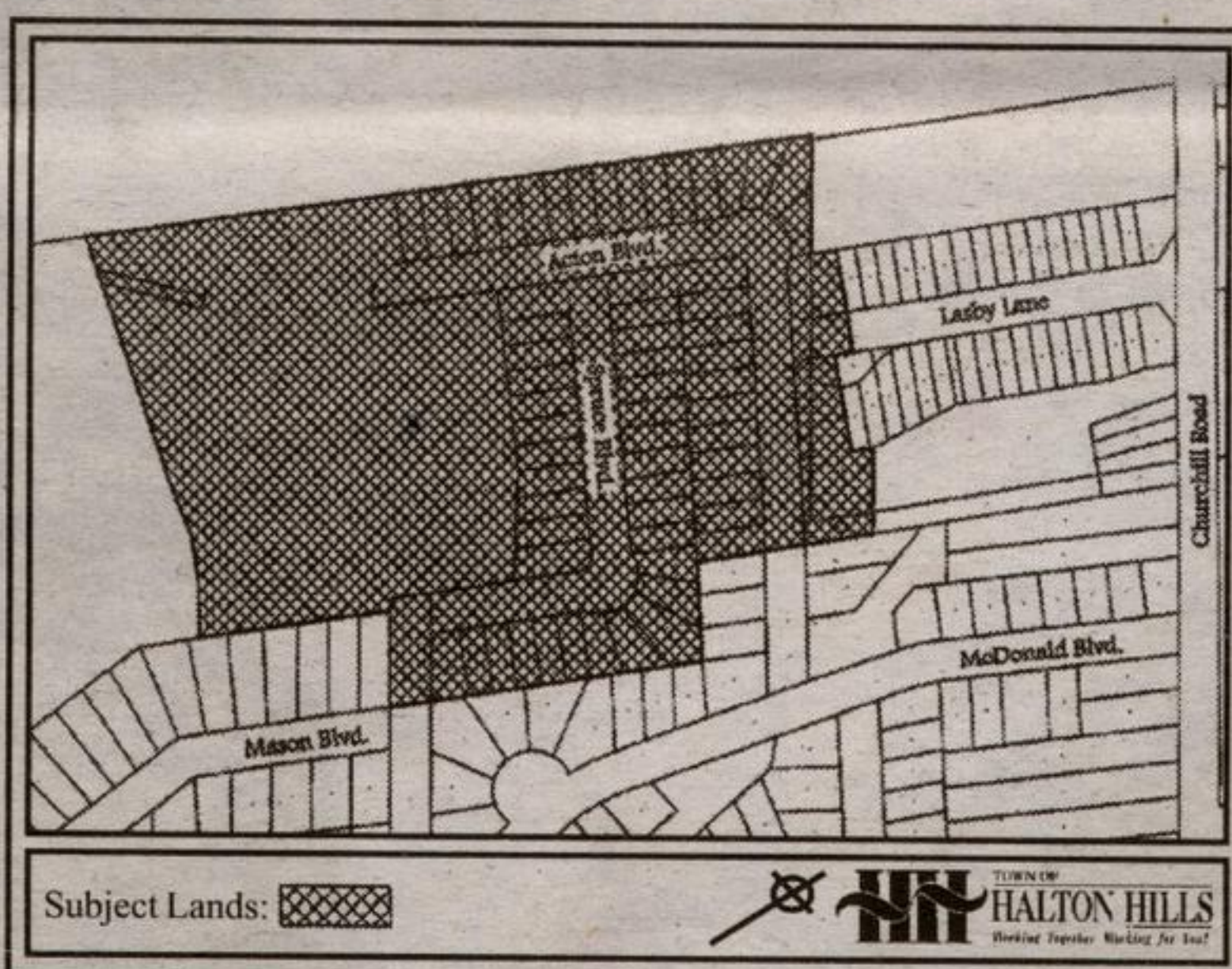

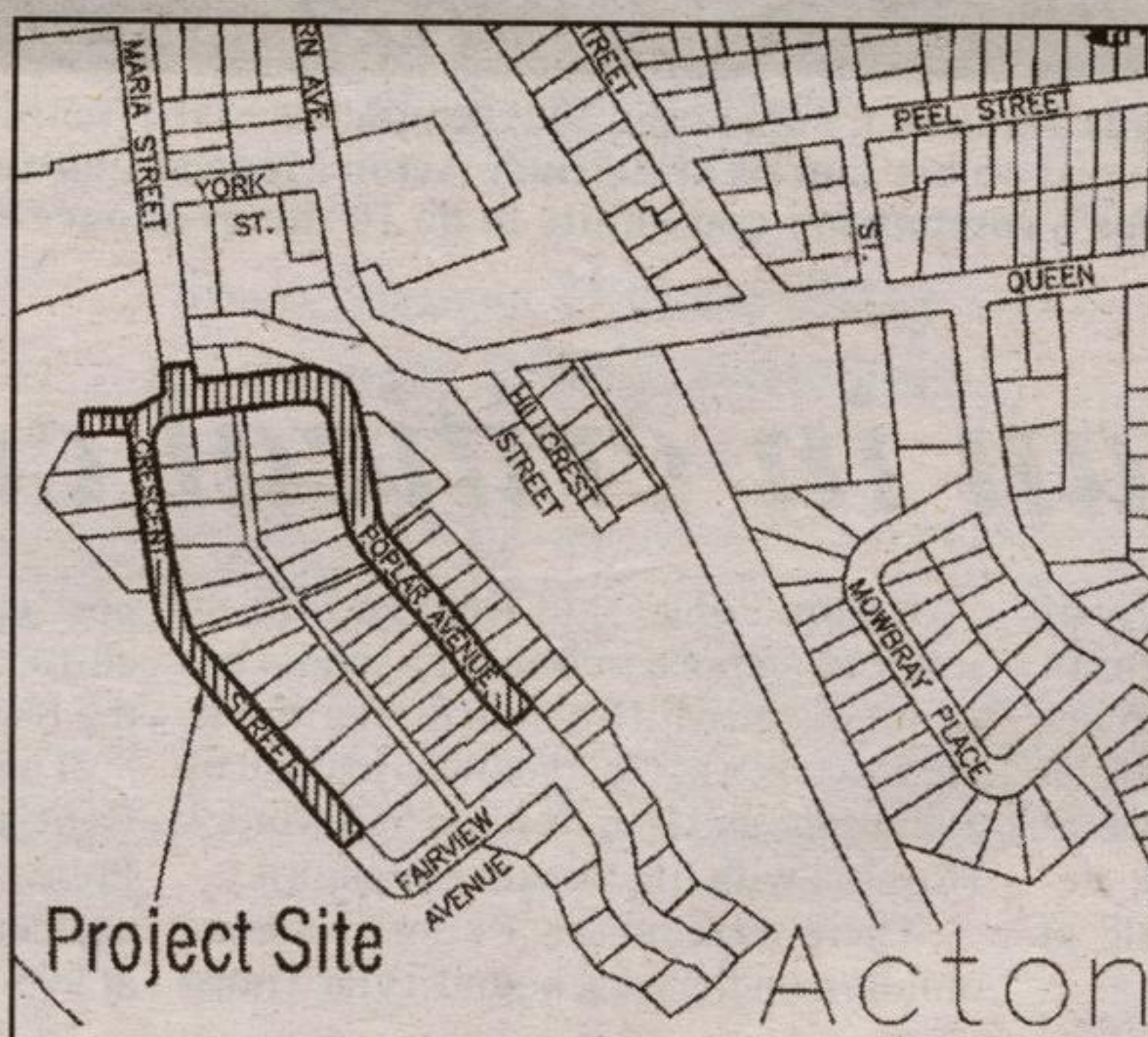
**CONSTRUCTION NOTICE**

Homicide ruled out in Virgin death

A surprising development in the death of 19-year-old Matthew James virgin occurred this week when homicide was dismissed as the cause of death and attributed to a collision with a motor vehicle.

A report from Wellington OPP said: "An extensive investigation was conducted by members of the County of Wellington OPP and Western Region Crime Unit under the direction of the Criminal Investigation Branch. All the facts surrounding his death were examined and reviewed by a team of investigators from the Ontario Provincial Police, the Center of Forensic Science and the Office of the Chief Coroner - Forensic Pathology Section. They concluded that his death was the result of a motor vehicle collision."

"Virgin was lying on the roadway when he was struck by a motor vehicle. The driver of the vehicle remained at the scene."

"No charges will be filed as a result of the motor vehicle collision. The investigation is now concluded."

Last week The New Tanner reported police were saying little about the investigation, which was ruled a homicide. The 19-year-old was found battered and bleeding at the side of the Ninth Line in Erin Township on Sept. 10, 2001. He died, at a Hamilton hospital, two days after he was found lying at the side of the Ninth Line, north of 32 Side Road.

A meeting between investigators and medical officials was postponed and rescheduled last week when the conclusion was reached.

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
