## Three lucky lottery winners

There are no flashy cars, jewels or wild spending sprees for the three Acton residents who had big lottery wins recently - the main plans for two who won just over \$75,000 each, include paying bills, taking trips and investing the balance.

Rural Acton resident Sue Stone-Dudas had the biggest win - \$76,233.60 - which was second prize in the January 16 LOTTO 6/49 draw.

After paying debts, Stone-Dudas said she and her husband Steve plan to do some home renovations and invest the remainder for retirement.

Stone-Dudas, a Burlington auto parts store manager, is a regular lottery player who buys five tickets each week. Her biggest win until now was \$384, several years ago.

Stone-Dudas purchased the winning ticket at Mac's Milk in Acton, and said she didn't pay too much attention when the lottery terminal started making a lot of noise when she took the ticket in last week to check it.

"The (terminal) music goes off all the time and I figured I'd won a free ticket or \$10, no big deal, but then the store clerk and I both looked at the ticket and went 'huh," Stone-Dudas said on Friday.

"We kept looking at the ticket and we still couldn't believe it and then he (the store clerk) started checking the rest of the tickets. I just stood there and stared at the ticket while he went around the store telling people 'she won big, she won big,' and I still couldn't believe it."

After presenting the winning ticket at the lottery office in Toronto, Stone-Dudas, who said she was "paranoid" it would be stolen, rushed to the bank to deposit it.

Acton's Colin Ash was a winner for almost three months and didn't know it as his winning ticket - \$74,949

– sat unchecked on his desk until he checked all tickets last week.

Ash, a Toronto firefighter who has played lotteries for at least 10 years, said he usually lets his tickets pile up and checks for winners once or twice a year.

"I had about 50 tickets to check and this one (the winner) was about half way through and then I went on the Internet to check the numbers and find out what the prize was," Ash said on Sunday, adding a subsequent ticket

from the pile, a Super 7, was a \$142 winner.

"I'm pretty calm about it now, but I was really excited when my wife came down to my (home) office and asked if I had any winners. When I told her I had five numbers


