

Museum group meets tonight, speaker from Halton Museum

The third meeting to plan an Acton museum is taking place tonight (Thursday, Feb. 7) at St. Joseph's Church Hall at 7pm. Speaker is Paul Attack of the Halton Regional Museum.

At the group's second meeting on January 10, attended by a dozen enthusiasts, they reviewed the business arising from the minutes. Bell Sanford gave a superb slide show of an example website he has compiled and there was agreement that it would likely be the first steps before an actual museum site.

Janis Fread told the meeting the BIA had discussed the possibility of an Acton museum and it was suggested it

be called a Heritage Display rather than a museum. Others suggested they might "piggy-back" or link to other existing websites such as Acton BIA or the olde Hide House.

Mark Rowe noted that funding is out there once a group is set up, but not to fund the set-up.

Heritage Acton has met and discussed the committee's existence and ideas, Kathy Sanford advised, and hoped they would the group to continue either under their umbrella or as a sub-committee.

Ena Gibson described a visit she had made to the Dufferin County Museum and the good impression it made on her. It was suggested that

the committee might want to interact with other organizations such as Heritage Halton Hills, Esquesing Historical Society and the Heritage Foundation of Halton Hills.

Mac Sprowl noted he had been at a luncheon where Mayor Kathy Gastle spoke of plans to convert part of the Acton Quarry lands into a pioneer village. Committee members saw this as complementary and not in conflict with their plans.

The second penalty was for contact with the goalie, and on Georgetown's first rush they, too were assessed a penalty for contacting the goalie, and Acton was able to kill off the remainder of the penalty.

Georgetown scored once near the end of the game, but Acton hung on for the 3-1 victory, giving them a 1-0 lead in the series. The second game is Saturday the 9th at 4:30 in Acton, with more games soon after.

"Home of the Week" - Your Building Experts

Four-bedroom estate home

Nothing has been omitted from this outstanding design. Double doors provide a dramatic entrance into the foyer, which overlooks the sunken living room to the left. This formal room is sure to impress guests, with its 10-foot coffered ceiling and huge feature windows.

The dining room, one step up from the living room, is conveniently large enough to entertain with ease. French doors lead on to a private veranda.

A second set of French doors open to a good-sized den off the foyer - a bonus room that could be put to a variety of uses, such as a home office or computer/study room.

The family's informal living area combines kitchen, breakfast room and family room in one huge great room which is sure to suit day-to-day living requirements.

The kitchen has a pantry, central work island with a range top and corner windows above the double sink make sure the room is always light and bright. The breakfast nook has a bay window that brings more light to the area and provides a comfortable spot to enjoy informal meals.

The family room has a vaulted ceiling and gas fireplace and is large enough for family members to enjoy with space to spare.

The master suite and one bedroom are located on the main floor, with the bedroom enjoying the luxury of its own en suite bathroom with shower.

The master suite is a sensational, private area with a corner fireplace to warm winter evenings and a bay window with access to the patio for summertime enjoyment.

As well as a full walk-in closet, an additional wall cupboard provides enough space in total to accommodate a huge wardrobe.

The sybaritic en suite bathroom includes a double vanity as well as a soaker tub, a generous-sized shower and a toilet area enclosed for privacy.

Large linen and broom closets in the main hallway add to the generous amount of storage space provided on this floor.

The laundry room has useful access from outside via a door off the veranda.

A second bathroom with a shower offers the opportunity for quick and convenient clean-up after working in the garden.

Upstairs, two more bedrooms share a full-sized bathroom with a soaker tub set into a bay and a shower enclosure.

The upper hallway offers a view of the family room below.

The triple garage certainly is not too large for a house of this size, but the plan's flexibility allows the garage to be reduced by one bay, if desired, shrinking the width of the house by 12 feet.

The house is 83feet wide and 58 feet, 6 inches deep with 2,879 square feet of living space and an unfinished basement.
