## POLICE BEAT

#### Civic torched

Flames from a red Honda Civic lit up the skies near Limehouse at 1:26 on Saturday morning.

The 1997 car had been stolen in Peel two days earlier, and was fully engulfed in flames when firefighters arrived at the scene on 22 Side Road, just west of Highway 7.

Police said the car, valued at \$6,500, is a write-off.

#### Hydro help

Acton firefighters kept motorists away from downed hydro lines and a damaged pole following a single vehicle accident on the Fifth Line at 22 Side Road on Friday at 3:51 p.m.

Police report the driver of the pick-up involved in the accident fled the scene after crashing into the pole.

#### House entered

Unknown suspects left empty-handed after breaking into an unoccupied, vacant house on Church Street West sometime between February 12 and 17.

Police said they caused \$200 damage to a rear door lock and smashed a window to get in and out.

#### **Electrical short?**

The smell of burning wires prompted a call to 911 from a resident of a Main Street North home at 1:50 p.m. last Thursday.

Acton firefighters discovered a possible electrical malfunction and called Halton Hills Hydro and a private contractor for follow up.

#### Drunk driver

A 43-year-old Scene Street man was charged with impaired driving and having over 80-milligrams of alcohol in 100-millilitres of blood after being stopped by police on Main Street at Park Avenue in Georgetown at 1:05 Sunday morning.

Police said the man showed obvious signs of impairment after his 1990 Buick LeSabre was pulled over for a routine traffic stop. He was arrested, charged and later released with a March 21, Milton court date.
