Major Bantams dispose of Fergus, Hespeler, Burlington

Fergus Highlanders came into Acton Monday night, February 18 with a nasty disposition, but Acton's Major Bantams Tanners, playing with a short bench, made haggis of Fergus' pretensions, sending them home with a 5-0 drubbing, their fourth consecutive round-robin Smith division Tri-County OMHA playoff win. Defenceman Eric Goll hammered Matt Bronizewski's clean draw through a screen to open the scoring early in period two. Thirty seconds into the third, Jon Tysoe's forechecking produced a clean possession behind the net for centre Pat Collins, who wasted no time walking around the unguarded side to jam in his first of three on the night. One interference penalty and less than a minute later, Fergus was looking at another centre-ice faceoff after Collins blasted home a setup from Goll 30 seconds into the advantage. Ten seconds later, Acton pressure again triggered a penalty to the visitors; this time the Tanners needed only 8 seconds to produce a nice goal from Chad Artem on good work by Bronizewski and Kurtis McArthur. The 75-second outburst made it 4-0 until Collins cleaned up Troy Ethier's rush from in close to complete his hattrick, five minutes into the third. Jordan Guindon in goal was tested infrequently, but needed to make some very good stops to earn the shutout.

Minor Novices Play in Stouffville tourney

 March 1 saw the Minor Novice Tanners off to a tournament in Stouffville. An AE-3 team playing in an AE-1 tournament, the Tanners did well opening against the Agincourt Canadians, losing a close game 4-2. Acton opened the scoring on a goal by John White. Jake Lewis passed the puck to roger Kirkness in the corner, and he passed it out into the crease, where white won a scramble to put the puck in the net, and earned his third goal of the season. Agincourt tied it early in the second, but Acton took the lead again with 22 seconds left in the second, as Nicholas Eagan took a pass from Jake Lewis and beat the defenceman and the goalie to give Acton the 2-1 lead. It was Lewis' second assist of the game. Acton held the lead until midway through the third period, but a too-many-men penalty for Acton, and a quick power-play goal for Agincourt, tied the game. At that point, "the wheels fell off," and Agincourt scored two more goals to win 4-2. John White was awarded the Tanner towel for his goal

and back-checking, the MVP medal was awarded to Nicholas Eagan. Second game of the tournament was against the eventual finalist host team from Stouffville, and Acton played their best game of the tournament, winning 5-3. Roger Kirkness opened the scoring for Acton, on a pass from Brandan Lockyer, but Stouffville tied it 15 seconds later. Nicholas Eagan put Acton ahead again on the

power-play, with Chris Chiasson drawing the assist, but again Stouffville tied it. Eagan then scored again on the power-play, this time from Roger Kirkness, and Acton let 3-2 after the first. Leading scorer Nicholas Eagan was not finished there, as he registered his third goal of the game, and team leading 32nd of the season, to give Acton the 4-2 lead. Stouffville cut the lead to 4-3, but Jesse Spurrell scored into
