## Unique Earth Week mass will be performed April 18-19

On April 18 and 19, 2002, in celebration of Earth Week, three time Grammy Award winner Paul Halley will be performing with the Georgetown Choral Society and the Georgetown Children's Choir in their presentation of 'Missa Gaia', an Earth Mass - a unique, contemporary, sacred sound of praise.

The talented Dale Wood will be conducting the Mass, created by the Paul Winter Consort, of which Mr. Halley was one of the original writers.

The Mass is a tapestry of mesmerizing sound, both ecumenical and ecological, one which embraces all the voices of the Earth. The howling of wolves, the joyous song of whales, the cries of baby seals and the haunting call of loons will resound through the sanctuary of Holy Cross Catholic Church, Georgetown, as they join the choirs in this celebration of Mother Earth. It intertwines many religious traditions, cultural music, historical periods and lyrical forms, including Gregorian Chant, the classic American hymn, contemporary jazz, popular

gospel songs, the African 12/ 8 rhythm, the Brazilian beat, poetry and simple folk tunes.

Compelling visual images of the 'Gaia', the ancient Greek name for home, earth and planet, will be digitally projected onto large screens to complement the music and heighten the sensory experi-

The orchestra will include the liquid-velvet tone of a saxophone, the multiple rhythms of the percussion and the creative improvisation of the organ. The organ used for the Earth Mass will be a stateof-the-art electronic Rodgers Trillium 957 that creates tones through Parallel Digital Imaging technology using samples of the finest pipe organs in the world. Its endless palette of orchestral sounds will lend itself to the sounds of nature and the universe.


