Minor PeeWees top Elora advance to league finals

Acton's Minor PeeWee Tanners advanced to the Tri-County League finals with a tie and a resounding win over Elora in the semi-finals.

Elora tied the Tanners 6-6 in the first game on February 27 in Elora but succumbed 12-4 when the series returned to Acton ice on March 13.

Elora opened the scoring in the first game midway through the first period but the Tanners tied it up on a goal by David Moore assisted by Thomas Glassford. Elora went ahead again in the see-saw battle early in the second and banged in another for a 3-1 lead before Josh Essiembre scored on a pass from James Reid to shave the lead to 3-2 with only 1:07 left in the second.

Not to be outdone, with only 15 seconds left in the period Josh Ceccotti passes in front to Elias Frechette who made no mistake and tied the game at 3-3. Still not finished, the Tanners rang up another marker by Jordan Kuenzig assisted by Braedon Halls, to go ahead 4-3 with only 2 seconds left.

Elora came back to tie the game early in the third and took the lead again, 5-4, at the midway mark of the third. The Tanners tied it again when Kuenzig pulled the string on a pass from Essiembre.

With only 5 minutes remaining Elora took the lead again but Matt Angell pulled the Tanners even with an assist from David Moore. And the game ended, 6-6.

The return game in Acton, March 13 was close until the second and third periods when the Tanners blew the game open.

Ken Wenzel put Acton ahead at the 4 minute mark unassisted only to have Elora tie it. In a three way passing play involving Josh Ceccotti, Ken Wenzel and Daniel Kearns, Kearns potted the goal that put the Tanners ahead again.

Ceccotti scored to put Acton ahead 3-1 in the second period on a rebound from Daniel Kearns. Elora drew to within one goal with 8:00 left in the second but Kuenzig popped in number four from Anthony Kri and Ken Wenzel.

Water Wise

Now is a good time to remind them of the dangers posed by rivers and ponds, swollen with spring rains and winter melt waters.
