Ronald McDonald is coming

Talk about fast food.

Less than a week ago, a vacant lot sat where the shell of Acton's new McDonald's restaurant is now taking shape and in less than three months, we'll be shaking hands

with Ronald McDonald.

Dave Beattie, owner of the two McDonald's in Georgetown and several Brampton locations, hopes to open in Acton on June 15, and can't wait to be part of the community as a supporter and employer.

While Acton's store will feature the famous Golden Arches, Beattie said we'd see a "new style McDonald's" that he described as "very tasteful and colourful with red and white, with a different roof line."

The interior will feature an L-shaped lobby with seating for 60 and there will be a small patio out front and a two-window drive-through.

Beattie will employ 60 staff in Acton, 15 to 20 of them full-time and the balance part-time. He's looking for staff, at least 15 years old, with a "can do" atti-

tude, a "real positive outlook" and students who have good grades.

The six or seven Acton employees who now work in Georgetown can transfer to Acton, and Beattie said they will accept applications for Acton at the Georgetown restaurant and will come to Acton for interviews after advertising later this month.

Those hired will be trained in Georgetown next month in readiness for the Acton opening. Part-time wages start at \$6.40 an hour and include some benefits, while day staff wages begin at \$7.50 an hour and include a full benefit package. All staff is eligible for rewards, incentives and half-price food.

Even before they open, Beattie has agreed to sponsor two local sports teams and said they intend to become involved in community events.

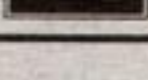

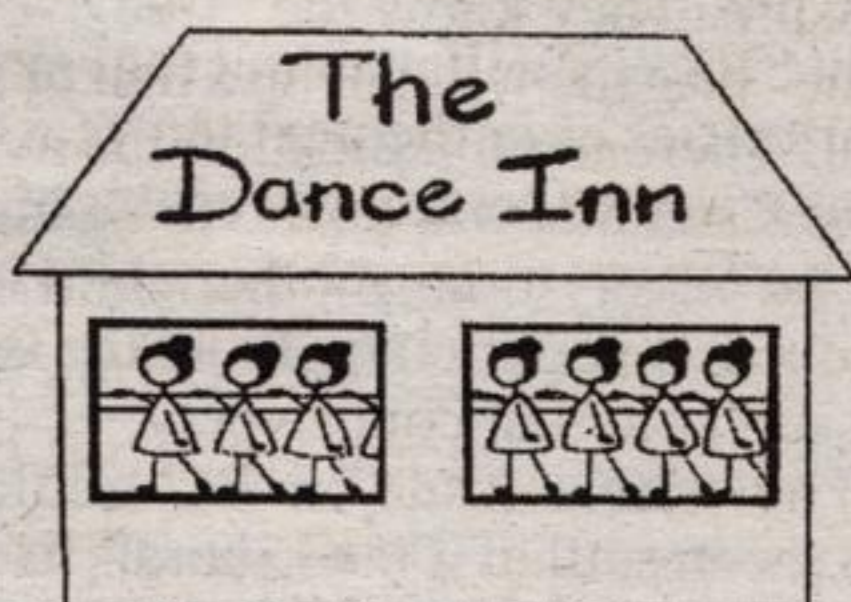
