31 AHS students compete in technical skills contest

Acton High School held its 4th annual Technical Skills Competition where students had the opportunity to demonstrate their expertise in various technical subject areas. Thirty one students in grades 9, 10, 11 and 12 competed for 3 ½ hours on tasks from framing walls and floors (team carpentry), building wooden shelves (cabinet making), creating architectural plans for a house (architectural design), and creating CAD drawings and 3d models of a hoist mechanism (mechanical design).

"We were very-pleased with the student participation this year and even more pleased to see that 25% of the awards went to female students. With the predicted shortages in skilled trades in the near future it is encouraging to see students of both genders take such an interest in technical studies", technical teacher Norbert Axtmann is quoted as saying. Special thanks go out to four former Acton graduates, David Wray, Don MacKay, Wes Almond, and David Smith who have all pursued technical careers and returned to help run and judge the competitions.



\$16 million Region surplus ticketed for roads, housing

Halton Regional Council has endorsed investing a \$16 million 2001 budget surplus in key Regional projects, including social housing initiatives and the rehabilitation of Regional Roads 5 and 25. A total of \$20.5 million of funding is available.

Although the 2001 budget surplus amounted to \$16 million, an additional \$4.5 million in surplus has been attributed to a reduction in the allowance for tax appeals. Over 50% of the surplus represents lower than anticipated costs for GTA social services pooling. Pooling represents monies that Halton and other GTA Regions must contribute to offset higher social housing and income and employment assistance costs in the City of Toronto.

While a pooling surplus was generated in 2001, Halton staff expressed concern that during an unstable economy, social programs carry with them major funding uncertainties creating significant financial obligations.

By contrast, operating programs over which Halton Region does have direct control generated only minor surpluses, representing only half of 1% of the approved budget.

"Funding social programs from the property tax base creates major problems as program costs can increase dramatically and quickly without a municipality having the ability to react," said Regional Chairman Joyce Savoline. "Add to this the pooling burden for Toronto whose pro-

gram costs can be significantly affected and Halton potentially faces an even greater outflow from our revenue base."

Regional Council approved the investment of the available funding as follows:

• \$3.7 million to match Federal funding to increase affordable housing initiatives expected to be announced shortly.

• \$8.3 million for major road and bridge repairs identi-

fied in the Regional Roads 5 and 25 Corridor Strategy. Significant work is required that has not been fully funded within the Region's existing budget.

• \$2.0 million for police capital projects.

The remainder of the 2001 budget surplus will be invested in the tax stabilization reserve, which is used to fund shortterm requirements and unanticipated expenditures.
