Wanting it real bad, Acton continued with the pressure, fending off the Woolwich attacks, and closed the game at 1:33 remaining with a Daniel Kearns goal off nice passes by Josh Ceccotti and Jordan Kuenzig. Score 5-2 Acton.

Game four, Wed, March 27, in Acton saw the Minor PeeWees displaying confidence and they came out skating.

Jordan Kuenzig sent a nice pass to Dan Kearns who netted goal number one for Acton with 12:06 remaining. Goal number two came with 7:29 left on the clock when Anthony Kri bagged one, assisted by Josh Essiembre. The rest of the period saw Acton performing some great penalty killing and Darren Pezzack playing solid in the net.

The second period started with Acton up 2-0 but

Woolwich stepped closer with their first goal of the game at 9:29, to make it 2-1. Acton answered at 2:49 with a plant by Jordan Kuenzig, Thomas Glassford assisting, and again, 26 seconds later with an unassisted goal by Josh Ceccotti. 3-1 Acton. Acton continued to pour it on. Daniel Kearns took the puck in his own end and carried it all the way to Woolwich and smacked it in. 5-1 Acton.

Woolwich scored another one with 11:26 remaining to make it 5-2 but could not bring it any closer.

Acton drove home the win with two more goals, by Jordan Kuenzig, first off a James Reid rebound, and second with 3:10 left in the game.
