# Wear your seatbelt – It's not an option

(Orillia, ON) - For a twoweek period starting the 13th of April, 2002, members of the Ontario Provincial Police will join with other police services across the province to take part in the 2002 Spring Seatbelt Campaign.

This joint initiative will concentrate on enforcement and education focusing on drivers and passengers who refuse to wear this proven life saving device.

Last year during the Spring Seatbelt Campaign, officers from the OPP checked 701,226 vehicles with a total of 14,412 individuals charged for not wearing their seatbelt during this time. Officers also laid 295 charges regarding children not being properly secured in approved child restraint systems. These numbers are not acceptable!

Through education, en-

forcement initiatives like the Spring Seatbelt Campaign, seatbelt usage has increased over the past years, however some drivers and occupants refuse to buckle up!

Study after study show conclusively that wearing seatbelts significantly reduces injuries and death in traffic collisions. The men and women of the OPP will be out diligently checking all occupants of motor vehicles from April 13-27, 2002 ensuring everyone is buckled up properly.




