New police unit to combat child abuse and sexual assault

Halton Regional Police Service has created a new unit from existing staff called the Child Abuse and Sexual Assault Bureau (CASA). Detective Sergeant Ken Cormier, in addition to his Major Crime Bureau responsibilities, will lead this unit of ten investigators.

On Monday, April 8, 2002
CASA became operational, and is based out of the Halton Regional Police Headquarters located at 1151 Bronte Road, Oakville. The mandate of this specialty unit will be to investigate all sexual assaults, child abuse cases where there is injury, and/or where there has been previous allegations of abuse made by the victim, or against a previously identified suspect.

CASA is a participating member of the Sexual Assault and Wife Assault Project (SWAP). As such, police find themselves interacting with over twenty com-

munity agencies, many of which have a role to play in supporting the victims and the investigation.

The formation of the CASA Bureau is important to Halton Region, and as Acting Chief Gary Crowell states, "This Bureau's scope of responsibilities ensures that because of a centralized response, all sexual assault and child abuse cases in our Region will continue to be managed in a professional, empathetic manner by highly trained officers

Our partnerships and ongoing communication with related community agencies can only enhance the police service's ability to protect, serve and support the victims we encounter in our investigations. Being centralized will allow us to efficiently utilize the computerized case management tools provided through the Ontario Major Case Management system."


