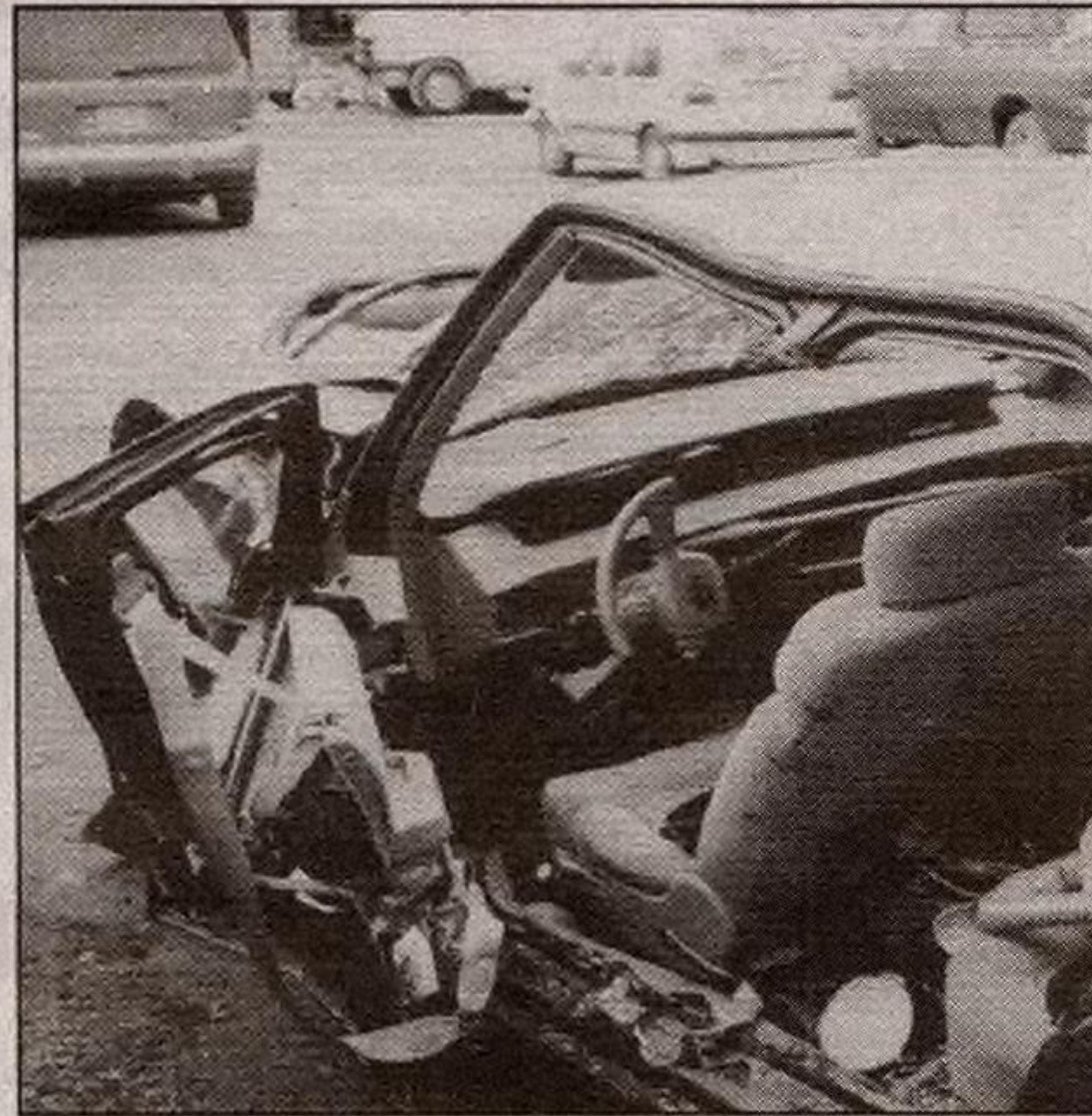

dent scenes Pyrah said he'd ever seen.

Michael Overland, 40, of Acton was driving his red Ford Ranger truck west-bound behind Gamble when the accident occurred.

Police said Overland went into the ditch when he at-

tempted to swerve out of the way of the crash, and struck the rear end of Gamble's car. He was not injured when his airbags deployed.

PC Pyrah said poor road conditions were a major factor in the accident that closed Highway 7 for three hours and no charges would be laid.

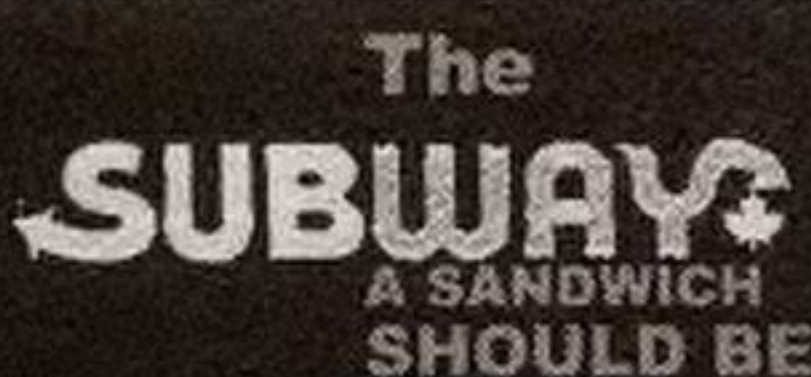

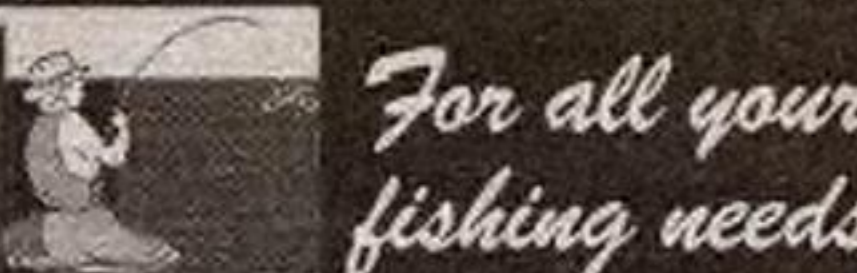

RABIES

Now that the warmer weather has finally arrived, more people are out and about exploring all that Acton has to offer.

It is time for a reminder to all of Acton's citizens, but most especially the children, to be wary of any animal that is acting strangely.

In the Acton area the most common carriers of the rabies virus are foxes, skunks, raccoons and bats. However, almost any animal may become infected.

Be wary of any animal that appears frightened, vicious, sick or displays any combination of these conditions.

If you see any animal that you suspect may have rabies, do not approach it. Call our local animal control officer at 905-877-6235 or contact your local police service.

If you or your child should be unfortunate enough to be bitten by any animal, wash the wound with soap and water, and apply an anti-septic. Report the incident to our local Health Department at 1-866-4HALTON. Rabies can be treated successfully in humans, with vaccines, as long as the disease is caught before symptoms begin.

Once symptoms are present, rabies is fatal. Please give serious consideration to having all your family pets vaccinated for rabies. For peace-of-mind about your health and theirs.

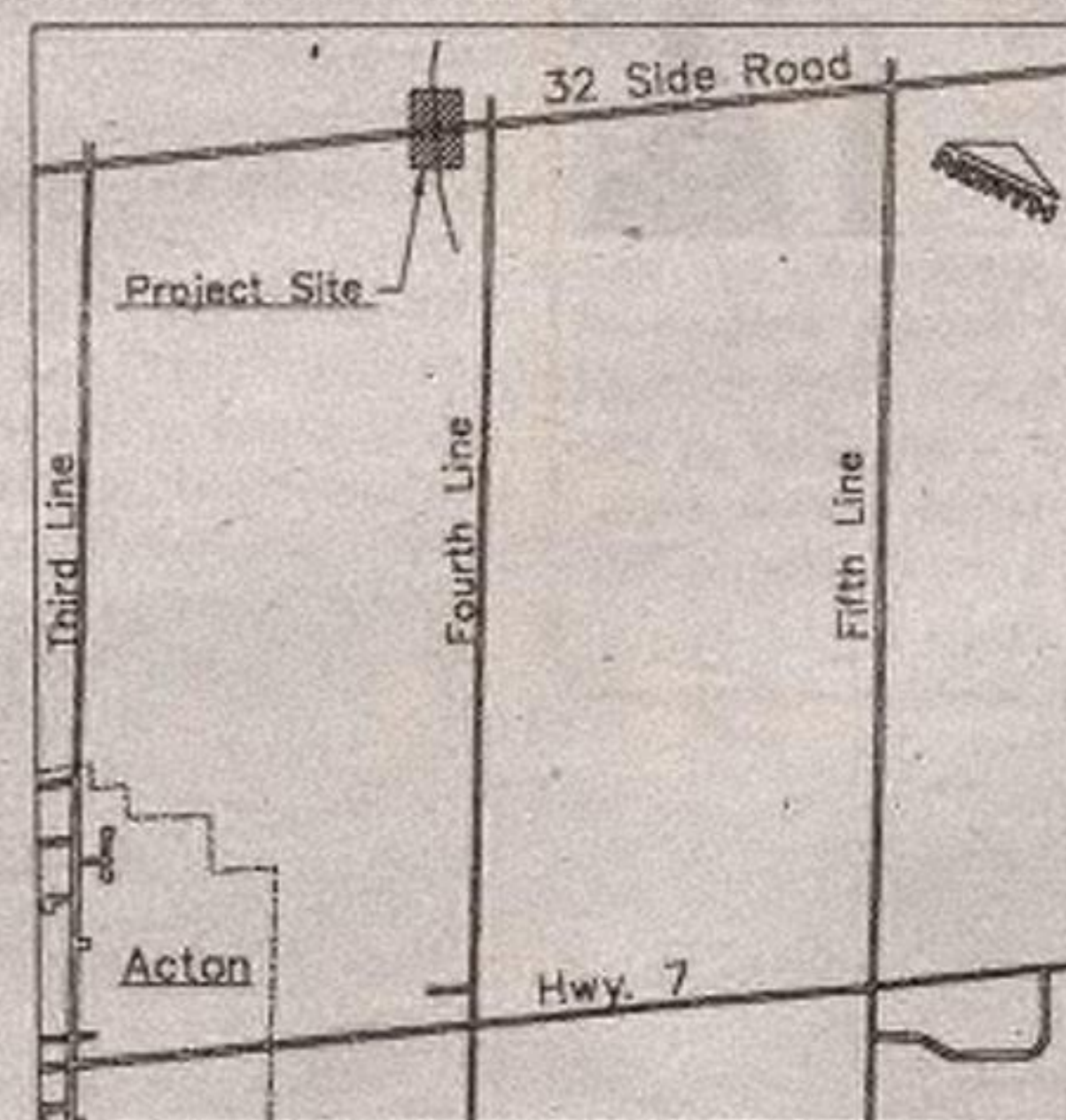

CONSTRUCTION NOTICE

Notice is hereby given pursuant to Section 300 (1) of the Municipal Act, being Chapter M-45 of the Revised Statutes of Ontario, 1990, that the Council of the Town of Halton Hills, at its meeting to be held in the Civic Centre at 6:30 pm Tuesday May 21, 2002, will consider passing a by-law for the extension of a culvert and the widening of 32 Side Road between Fourth Line and 100 metres west of Fourth Line.

During the extension of the existing box culvert, 32 Side Road will be closed on an emergency basis only. One lane of through traffic will be open at all times.
