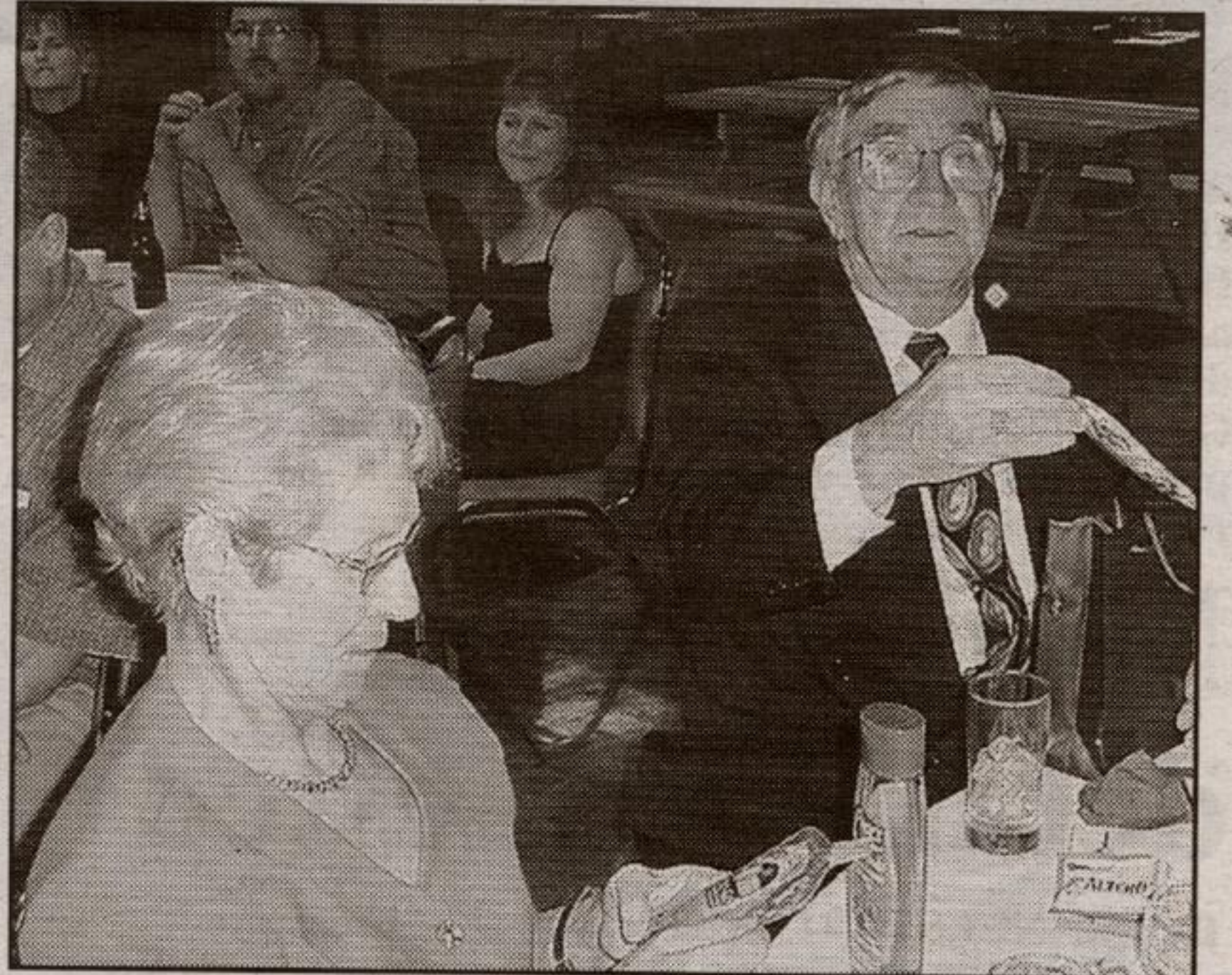

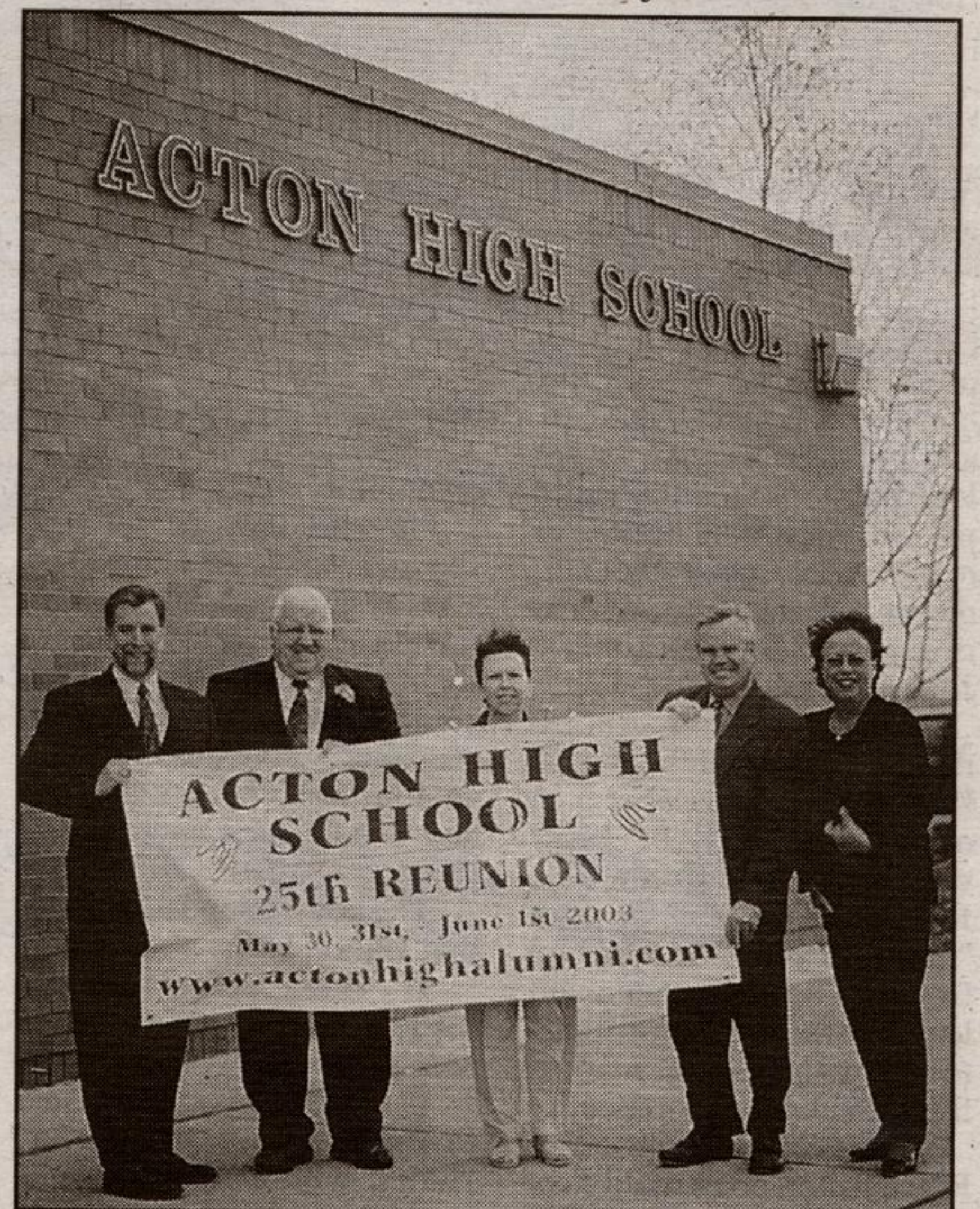
Did You Know?
