

OPTIONS: The Conference That Works For Women is returning to Halton for the third consecutive year on Tuesday, May 28 and Thursday, May 30. Free of charge, the two-day conference is geared to women in Halton who are currently unemployed or underemployed and are looking to learn more about the options available to them in today's workplace.

Close to 300 women have explored work and training options at the conference since its inception in 2000, many of whom credit the program for their subsequent personal and professional growth. Conference coordinators Debra Perris and Judy Henderson of Perris

contact all of the participants four weeks and 16 weeks after the conference to measure the effectiveness of the program.

Following last year's OP-TIONS conference, 90% of the attendees had developed an action plan, 51 % had pursued further education or training and 34% had found work or started their own business.


