Tancoo said potential buyers are impressed with the cheaper house prices, good quality workmanship and the quiet community.



No charges

No charges will be laid in connection with a recent alleged sexual assault at an Acton business, even though police haven't received results from tests on articles sent to the Centre for Forensic Science.

"We have conducted an investigation at an (Acton) business and that investigation has resulted in us not being able to confirm that an offence has even taken place," said Halton Detective Sergeant Ken Cormier on Friday.

D/S Cormier, supervisor of the child abuse and sexual assault unit, wouldn't identify the business or anyone involved in the investigation.

Asked how the investigation could be closed without the forensic test results on items Cormier wouldn't identify, he said, "probably even the results from the Centre would not likely change our conclusion."

POLICE BEAT

Police have released descriptions of two possible suspects and a van in connection with a break-in at the Mill Street Acton Medical Centre that was discovered at 9:50 on Monday night.

Drugs stolen in B&E

After prying open a ground floor office window, the suspects stole various narcotics, medicines and cash from the pharmacy before fleeing out the front door.

Several people reported seeing a red Chrysler Caravan in the area and described two possible suspects, both white males. The first has a

thin build and his head may be shaved. The second suspect was wearing a burgundy baseball cap.

Police said "it's possible" this incident is connected to the March 20 break-in and narcotics theft at the former Acton Pharmacy.

Open window invitation

Sometime between 1 and 5 p.m., the thief slid open an unlocked side window and ransacked the house before leaving by the side door. Police have no suspects.

BICYCLE HELMETS

Now that you have a record of your bicycles make, model and serial number, and keep your bicycle locked...The next step:

Purchase a quality, properly fitted bicycle helmet and wear the helmet!

Studies have shown that a properly fitted bicycle helmet can reduce the risk of serious head injury by as much as 85%.

Nobody plans to fall off their bicycle and injure themselves, but accidents do happen and your fitted bicycle helmet is your best line of defense to prevent serious head injury.

Remember, bicycle helmets are mandatory for persons up to 18 years of age. Section 104 (2.2) of the Ontario Highway Traffic Act provides that; no parent or guardian of a person under 16 years of age shall authorize or knowingly permit that person to ride on or operate a bicycle on a highway unless the person is wearing a bicycle helmet.

Parents please take the time to talk with your children about the importance of bicycle safety and especially, the proper wearing of their bicycle helmets.

If you, the parent, are a bicycle rider...please set a good example for your kids.

NOTICE TO PROPERTY OWNERS WEED CONTROL

THE ONTARIO WEED CONTROL ACT AS IT APPLIES TO PERSONS IN POSSESSION OF LAND WITHIN THE TOWN OF HALTON HILLS

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that unless noxious weeds are destroyed by June 10, 2002 and as often as is necessary throughout the season to prevent the ripening of their seeds and the dispersal of their pollens, the Town of Halton Hills may enter private property and destroy these weeds. The costs will be charged against the property owner and collected in the manner of municipal taxes.

For information of all property owners, the following are designated as noxious weeds in the Town of Halton Hills;

Bull Thistle	Nodding Thistle
Canada Thistle	Poison Hemlock
Colt's Foot	Poison Ivy
Common Barberry	ProsoMillet, Black seeded
Cypress Spurge	Ragweed
Dodder	Russian Thistle
European Buckthorn	Scotch Thistle
Goat's Beard	Sow Thistle
Johnson Grass	Tuberous Vetchling
Knapweed	Leafy Spurge
Wild Carrot	Milkweed
Yellow Rocket	

Complaints regarding dandelion and golden rod will not be accepted as these are not considered noxious weeds pursuant to the Weed Control Act.
