



CONSIDERATION OF APPLICATIONS MADE BY DUFFERIN AGGREGATES TO EXPAND THE MILTON QUARRY

Applications have been made by Dufferin Aggregates to amend the Niagara Escarpment Plan (Amendment 135) and obtain a Development Permit and to amend Halton's Regional Official Plan (Amendment 18), the Town of Halton Hills Official Plan (Amendment 103), and the Town of Milton Official Plan and zoning by-law to permit aggregate extraction to the north and east of the existing North Quarry in Milton.

The lands involved are located within Lots 13 and 14, Concession 1 (Esquesing), in the Town of



Halton Hills, Milton and Halton Regional staff have completed their review and are providing a report with recommendations for consideration at the meetings noted below. The amendments to the Regional and Municipal Official Plans must conform to the Niagara Escarpment Plan. The Niagara Escarpment Commission has not scheduled a date to consider the applications before it.
