Grass clippings no longer accepted

Halton Region's Waste Management Services Division reminds residents that grass clippings are no longer collected as part of yard waste or regular garbage collection. Residents are encouraged to grasscycle instead for the good of the environment and for the good of you lawn.

Grasscycling is the process of recycling grass clippings by leaving them on your lawn. Grasscycling saves time, reduces waste and produces a deeper, healthier root system that increases your lawn's resistance to disease, drought and insects, and improves its ability to crowd out weeds.

Grass clippings can also be added to your compost in layers or disposed of at the Halton Waste Management Site (\$5 for loads up to 150kg).

There are some good reasons to grasscycle:

1. Grasscycling improves lawn quality. When grass clippings are allowed to decay naturally on the lawn, they release valuable nutrients and encourage natural soil aeration by earthworms.
2. Grasscycling saves

time and work. A recent study found that 147 homeowners who stopped bagging their clippings saved an average of 35 minutes per mowing. That adds up to seven hours per season!

3. All lawn mowers can grasscycle. For best results, 'don't mow too low.' Mowing your lawn to a height of 6 to 8 centimetres (2.5 to 3 inches) will encourage longer roots, resulting in healthier grass, better drought resistance and increased ability to crowd out weeds. Also, keep the mower blade sharp and mow only when the grass is dry.
4. Grass clippings are a free, high-nitrogen fertilizer. When clippings decompose, they release their nutrients back into the lawn. They contain nitrogen, potassium and phosphorus, as well as other essential plant nutrients. When left on the lawn, clippings rapidly break down into these nutrients, which are returned to the lawn. Better yet, there is no polluting chemical runoff, no use of non-renewable resources, and no damage to soil organisms or wildlife.

EXPANSIVE FAMILY HOME

Victorian-style detailing highlights the exterior of this expansive family home, suitable for acreage or a very large lot.

A covered porch, fish-scale shakes under the roof peaks, an open balcony and stone features combine to give the house its eye-catching exterior.

Off the two-storey foyer, half-walls flank the entrance to the dining room on one side and a door opens to the den on the other. The dining room has a vaulted ceiling, again enhancing the spaciousness of the room.

The great room, with its gas fireplace and vaulted ceiling, overlooks the entire area, and the fireplace is centrally placed to be enjoyed from all around.

The kitchen is large enough to encourage more than one member of the family to prepare meals side-by-side. A sizable work island and a pantry add to the efficiency of the kitchen area.

The charming breakfast room is set into a carquiel bay window with a door that opens on to a covered patio.

Upstairs, the stunning master suite at the back of the house has a vaulted ceiling, an en suite bathroom with a double vanity, and a walk-in clothes closet. The children of the family will have to draw straws for bedroom No. 4, at the front of the house, which has a vaulted ceiling and its own private sun deck. Bedroom No. 3 also has a vaulted ceiling and the two rooms share the main bathroom with bedroom No. 2, which overlooks the back garden.

The house is 64 feet, 4 inches wide and 49 feet deep with 2,244 square feet of living space and an unfinished basement.
