## Girls' Soccer team ties Brampton and Milton

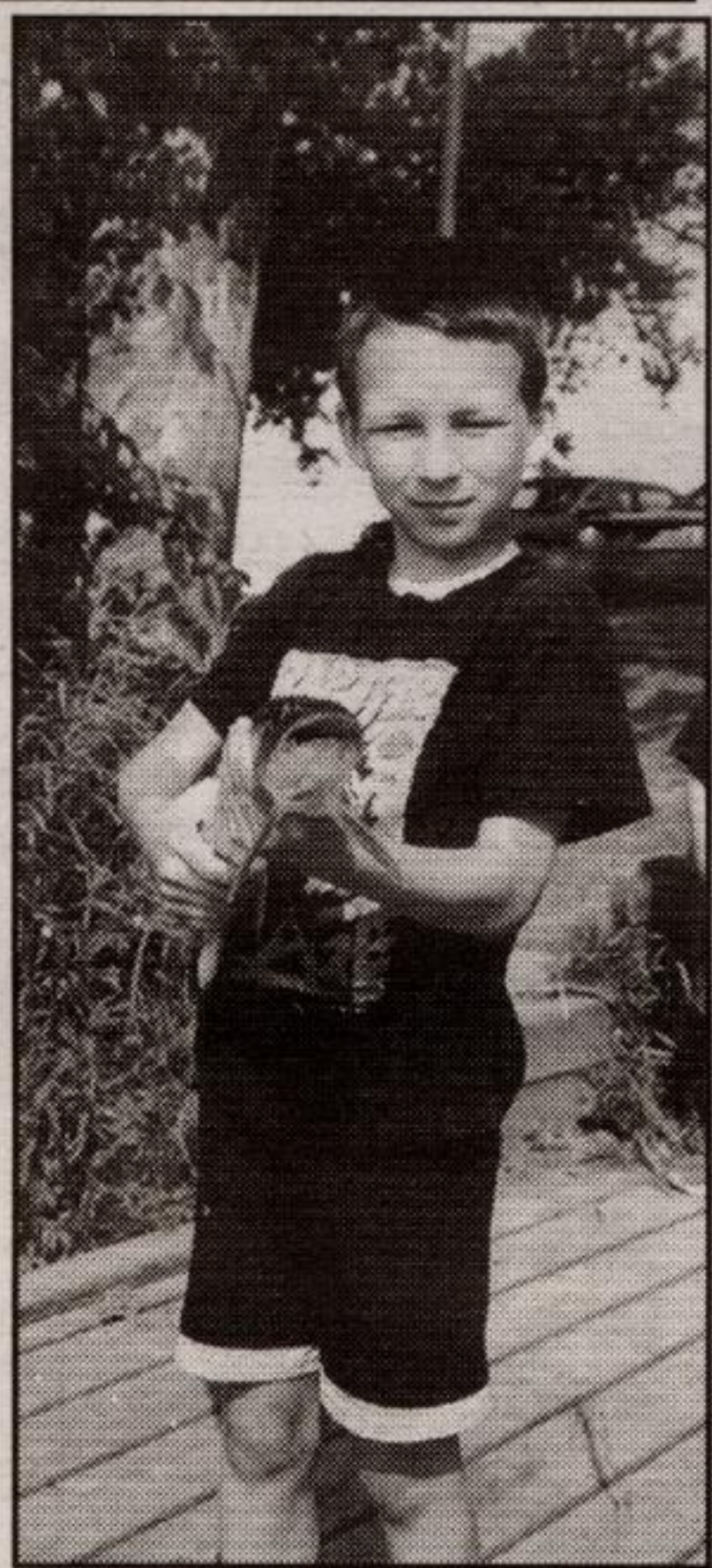

## Ducks go down swimming at year end championships

Coach Julie Wilson gathered up eight swimmers from the Aqua Ducks who were willing to go an extra week on the season and headed to Etobicoke for a newly created Central Ontario Regional Championship.

The Ducks were the only club from outside the Toronto area. The competition was broken down into three divisions: Over 50 swimmers, 25 to 50 swimmers and Under 25 swimmers. The Ducks competed in the Under 25 division.

All eight swimmers scored for the club, led by Sarah Keith capturing two Golds, three Silvers and one Bronze.

After 88 of 97 events the Ducks led their division by 175 points. However, they

ended up in a remarkable second place with a score of 918 to a Toronto team with 1055 points.

Head Coach Gerry Ockenden popped in on the meet Sunday to see how the club was doing. Much to my surprise, and I only say that because it is the end of a long 10 month season and the kids are tired or at least I thought they were, with the help of Julie they reached deep down inside and put on one heck of a show not only for their parents, but for the crowd in general.

Not only did they come in a close second, they outscored teams with as many as 44 swimmers on them.
