Karate College Trip for trio

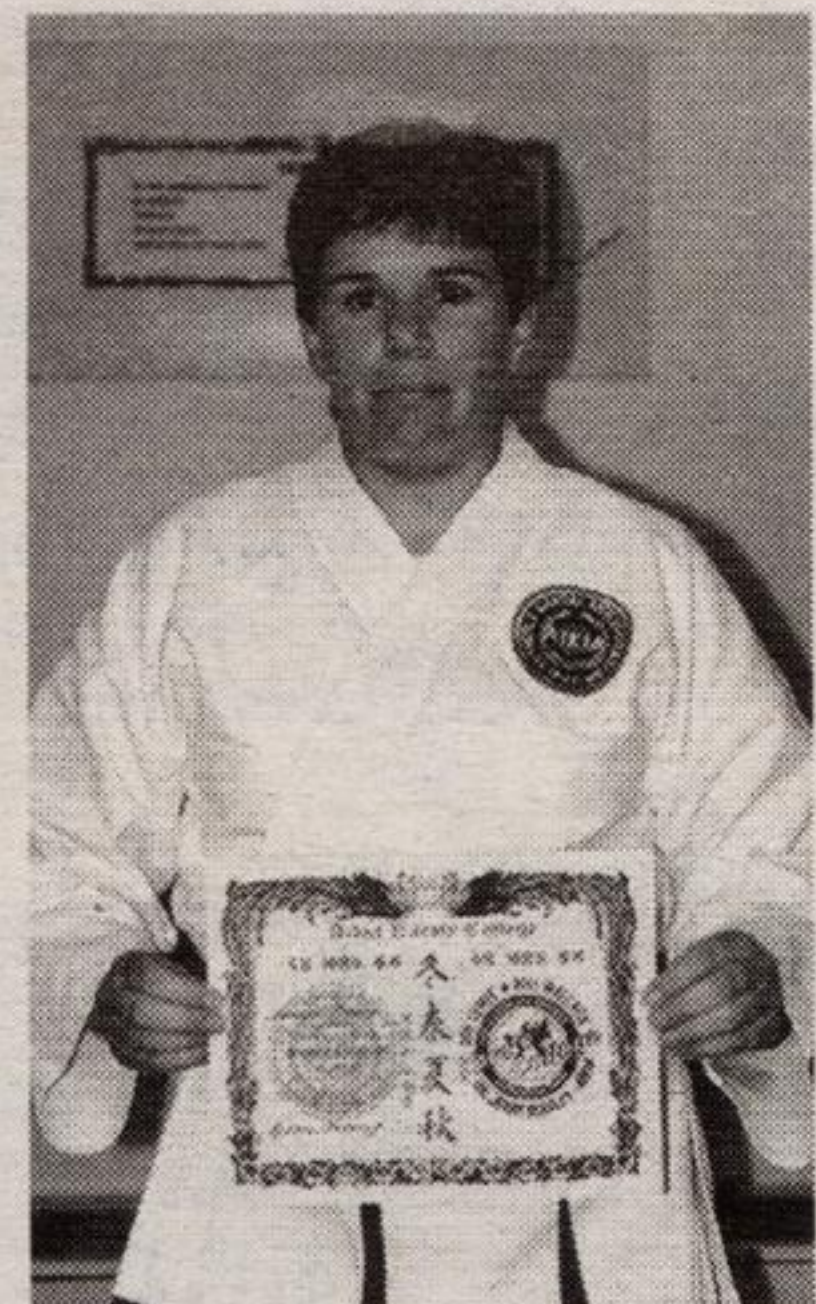

The official opening ceremony for Halton Region Museum on Wednesday, June 19 was followed by tours of the \$1.87 million renovation project. Funding for the museum renovations was approved by Halton Regional Council in February, 2001 and renovations started in April.

Halton Region Museum is located on the original site of the Alexander Family farmstead at Kelso. The newly renovated Hearth Room is climate-controlled, expanded and provided with new wash-room and a kitchen facility making it a prime location for weddings and receptions while the Loft room has been climate-controlled and expanded to increase school usage.

BASEMENT ENTRY PLAN

A soaring double-storey entrance with brick columns distinguishes the exterior of this three-bedroom basement-entry plan.

Stairs from the entrance lead to the second-level living area, where an open dining room and living room offer plenty of space for family gatherings and for entertaining.

A gas fireplace in the living room offers warmth and a cosy focus for the winter months and a boxed-out buffet provides useful extra space.

The open-plan informal family living area is spacious and efficiently designed. The kitchen has a work island and a pantry and the breakfast nook has a bay overlooking the large sun deck.

The family room occupies the other half of this area, providing plenty of space for all day-to-day living activities.

In the sleeping wing, the master suite is located at the rear of the house, with a four-piece en suite bathroom that includes a double vanity. A walk-in clothes closet offers lots of room for his and her clothes.

Bedrooms two and three share the main bathroom.

A laundry room has useful shelving. Coat, linen and broom closets complete the main floor.

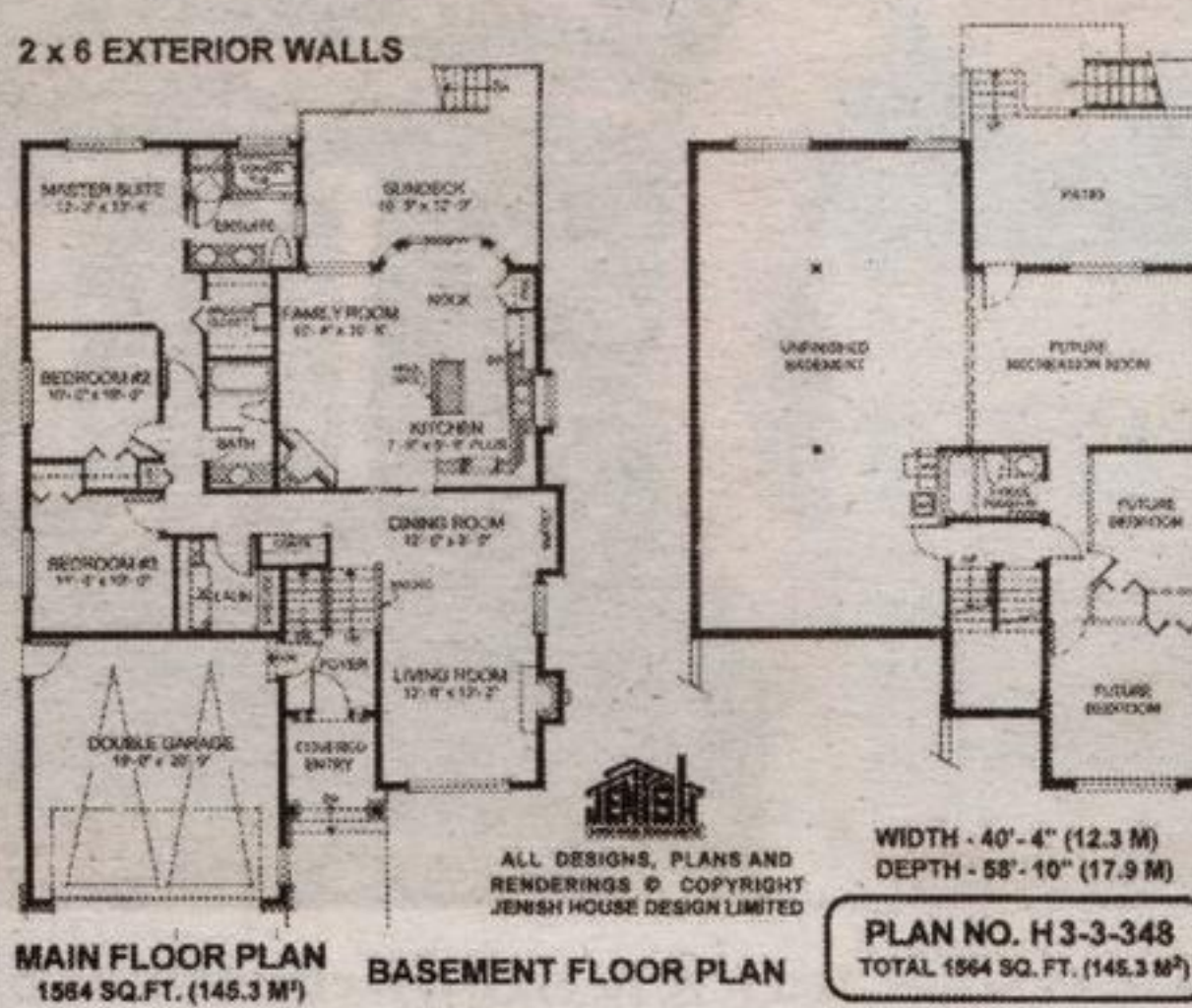
The unfinished basement has a roughed-in bathroom and a recreation room and two extra bedrooms are all ready for future development, as and when required.

The house is 40 feet, 4 inches wide and 58 feet, 10 inches deep with 1,566 square feet of living space.
