

# Special collection Monday, August 19

Halton Hills Special Waste Collection will take place from August 19 to 23.

Items must be placed curbside by 7:00am on Monday,

August 19 and will be collected between Monday and Friday.

Items which will be collected during Special Collection week include: household furni-

ture, mattresses, electronic equipment, plumbing fixtures, etc.

Residents are reminded to remove doors from appliances; bundle loose material such as wood in lengths no longer than 4 ft. (3 bundles max.); do not pile items on top of one another; keep metal items apart from other material - metal is collected separately.

The following materials will not be collected: building and demolition debris, propane tanks, concrete and bricks, household hazardous waste, cardboard boxes, tree branches, tree stumps, soil and rocks, automobile parts, and tires.

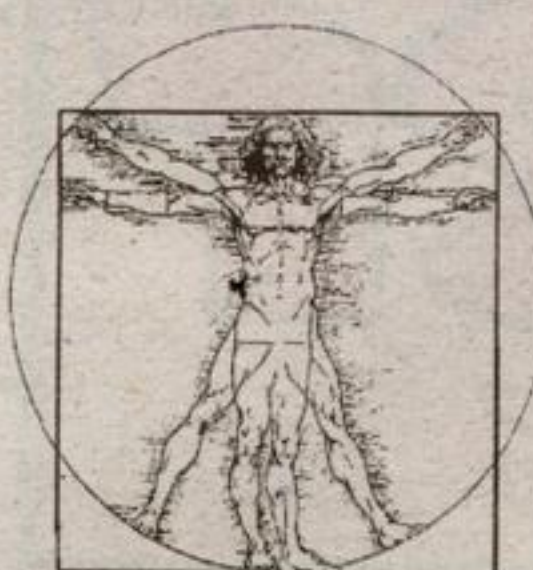

The recent hot, hazy and humid days (and nights) of summer have made life difficult for many Acton Citizens.

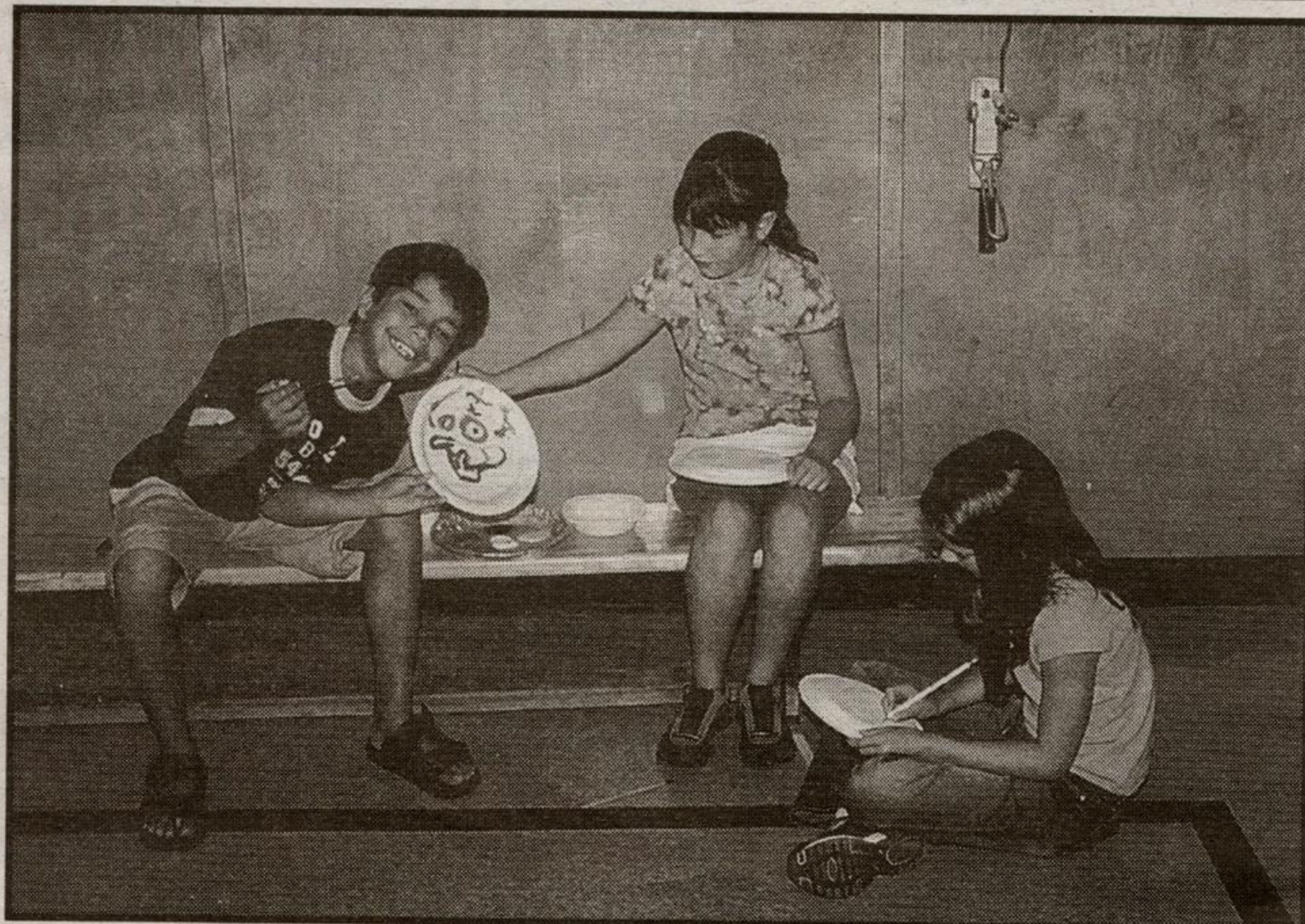
We know that as little as ten minutes in the sun can cause exposed skin to burn. We know that the heat and humidity make daily chores difficult and the nights very uncomfortable.

Now take a moment and imagine what it would be like, if you were wearing a fur coat. Family pets suffer from the heat and humidity even more than ourselves. Your Halton Regional Police Service and your local Animal Control officers have recently rescued family pets, that unthinking people have left locked in cars or chained in the yard, in the blazing heat all day.

I ask all pet owners to please, provide plenty of fresh water and protection from the sun for all of your pets.

Do not take family pets in the car, even for a short ride in hot weather. It takes just a few minutes in a car interior to reach deadly temperatures. Leaving the car windows down a couple of inches doesn't cool the interior. At home, provide a cool, shady place for your pet to rest during the day.

Veterans from all of the Legions and the Merchant Navy Association wholeheartedly supported the designation at a meeting earlier this summer and Halton council formally passed the honorary designation at its meeting last month.

Savoline said the veterans wanted the designation ceremony to take place as close to Remembrance Day as possible and chose October 20 for the date.

Savoline said that they will hold a dedication ceremony near the Regional headquarters in Oakville that day and then travel northward by bus, picking up veterans along the way and end with another ceremony in Acton and then a reception at the

Acton Legion.

"My family and I came to Canada in 1953 from Shanghai in China, and at that point were refugees," Savoline said, adding her family was displaced by the war and spent two-and-a-half years in a refugee camp before being sponsored by another family member to come to Canada.

"I know from personal experience what vets did when they laid down their comfortable, safe lives in Canada and went to war, setting their own lives aside and some of them giving their lives," she said, adding the veterans didn't come back from the war complaining, but to help build the "strongest and best country in all the world. They deserve this honour."

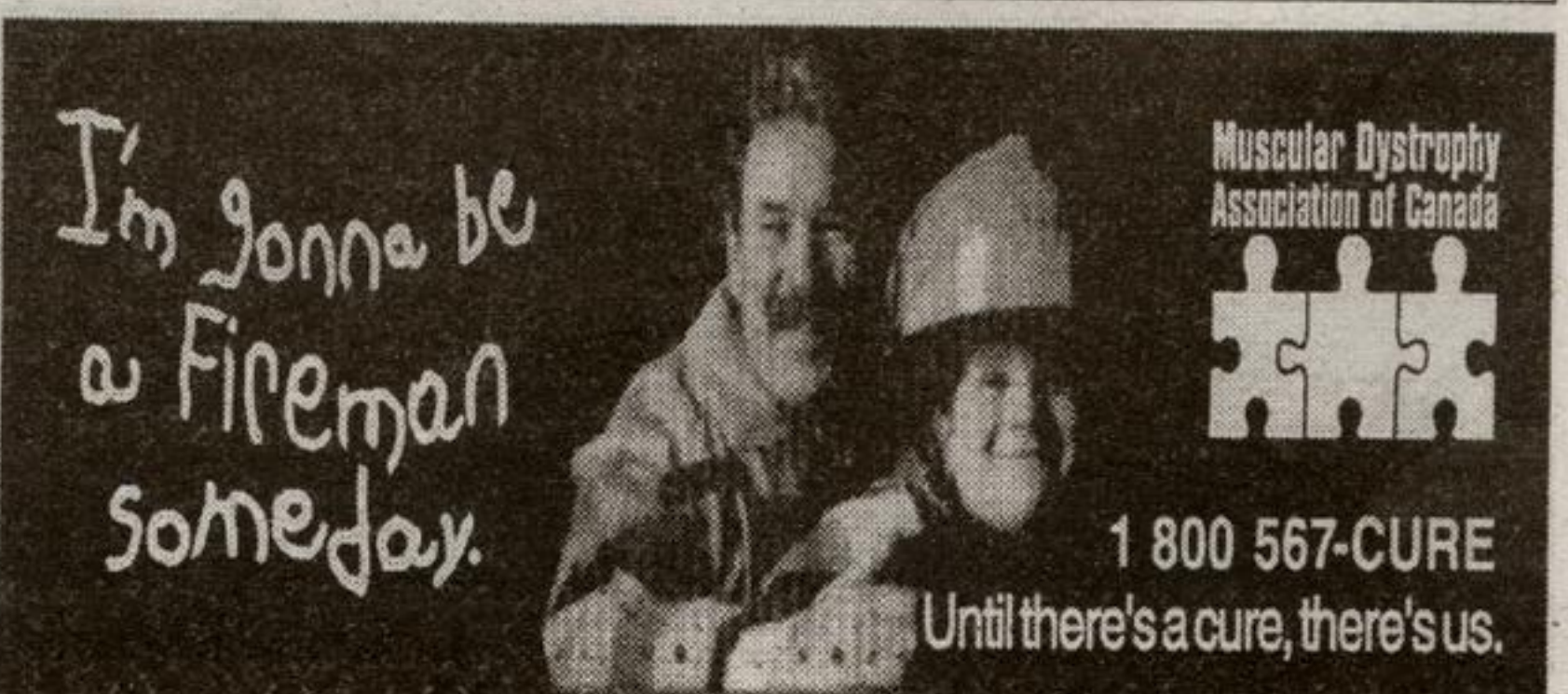

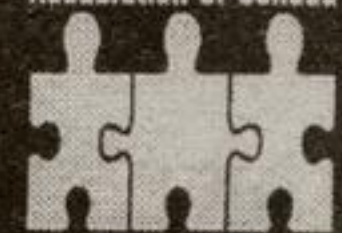
