Disbelief, shock and happiness. Those emotions—and a few tears—showed on Rachel Wallace's face during the seconds after she was named Miss Acton at the Fall Fair on Friday night. Wallace, 15, was also selected by the other 10 entrants to receive the congeniality award, named after the late Margaret Hall, Miss Acton 1966, who also ran the pageant for more than a decade.

Wallace, who lives in rural Acton and attends Erin High School, was hugged by family and friends who were among a large and enthusiastic crowd that packed a tent on the tennis courts for the public part of

Each entrant had already had a private interview with the judges, former Miss Actons, prior to the public part of the pageant that included a three-minute speech and an impromptu question-and-answer session.

In her biography, Wallace listed her hobbies as basketball, snowboarding, cross-country running and tennis. She was named valedictorian in Grade 7 and has received a most improved student award as well as being on the honour

roll in Grades 7, 8 and 9.




