Sideswipes by trucks on Mill and Main

A pick-up truck, possibly black, sideswiped a truck being driven through Acton by a Tobermory resident at 11 p.m. last Thursday.

Police said the complainant was northbound on Main Street at Vimy Street in his 1994 Ford pick-up truck when the suspect vehicle sideswiped him and fled southbound on Highway 25, without stopping. Damage to the Ford is \$2,500.

Sign damaged
 A "tall" vehicle, possibly a cube van or transport truck, is believed responsible for side-swiping a parked car and smashing part of a fluorescent overhead sign on Mill Street, just

east of Main Street, sometime between 9 and 4:40 p.m. last Thursday. Damage to the parked car that belongs to an Acton woman, is estimated at \$300.

Loud drunk arrested
 A 20-year-old rural Acton man was held by police until he sobered up after being arrested on Mill and Main Street at 12:03 Sunday morning and charged with public intoxication.

Police said the obviously intoxicated man was yelling and declined an offer of a ride home from police and

was arrested. He appears in court October 31.

Police pursuit
 Halton police chased a speeding car for a short distance through rural Halton Hills before the intoxicated driver pulled over on 27 Side Road, west of the 8th Line.

Police were called at 9:59 p.m. on Saturday when a 1988 Honda struck another car on the 8th Line and the driver took off when police arrived on the scene. Police said speeds reached 80-km/h before the pursuit ended.

A 22-year-old River Valley man was arrested and charged with impaired driving, driving with more than 80-milligrams in 100-millilitres of blood and flight from police. He was held for bail.

False alarm
 An alarm activation that turned out to be a false alarm had Acton firefighters racing to a Greenore Crescent home at 8:46 on Sunday night. No problem, or reason for the activation, could be found.

Grass fire
 Acton firefighters extinguished a small fire burning behind an Elmore Drive home at 3:15 on Sunday afternoon. No damage or injuries were reported.

Faulty alarm
 The sound of a fire alarm in an unoccupied house on Churchill Road sparked a visit by Acton firefighters to the property at 5:06 p.m. last

Thursday. The alarm could be heard coming from the second floor, and with the homeowner away at the time, firefighters entered the house and found a faulty smoke alarm.

Gas smell
 A Church Street East homeowner who thought he smelled gas while doing maintenance on his furnace at 2:58 last Thursday afternoon called Union Energy, which then called 911 for help. Acton firefighters checked the house but didn't detect any levels of gas or find any leaks.

Assist accident victims
 Acton firefighters helped an ambulance crew with two injured people after their 1994 Land Rover rolled on Highway 25, south of 15 Side Road, at 2:37 last Thursday afternoon.

The Rover was heading north on Highway 25 when it veered off-road, flipped and ended up in the southbound ditch. No other details were available from fire or police officials.

Oops
 An IGA customer, no doubt very embarrassed, summoned Acton firefighters to the IGA plaza at 5:05 p.m. last Tuesday after mistaking the fire alarm pull station for the device to open the IGA doors.

Acton firefighters couldn't get the pull station, located between IGA and PharmaPlus, back in working order and advised management to make the necessary repairs as soon as possible.

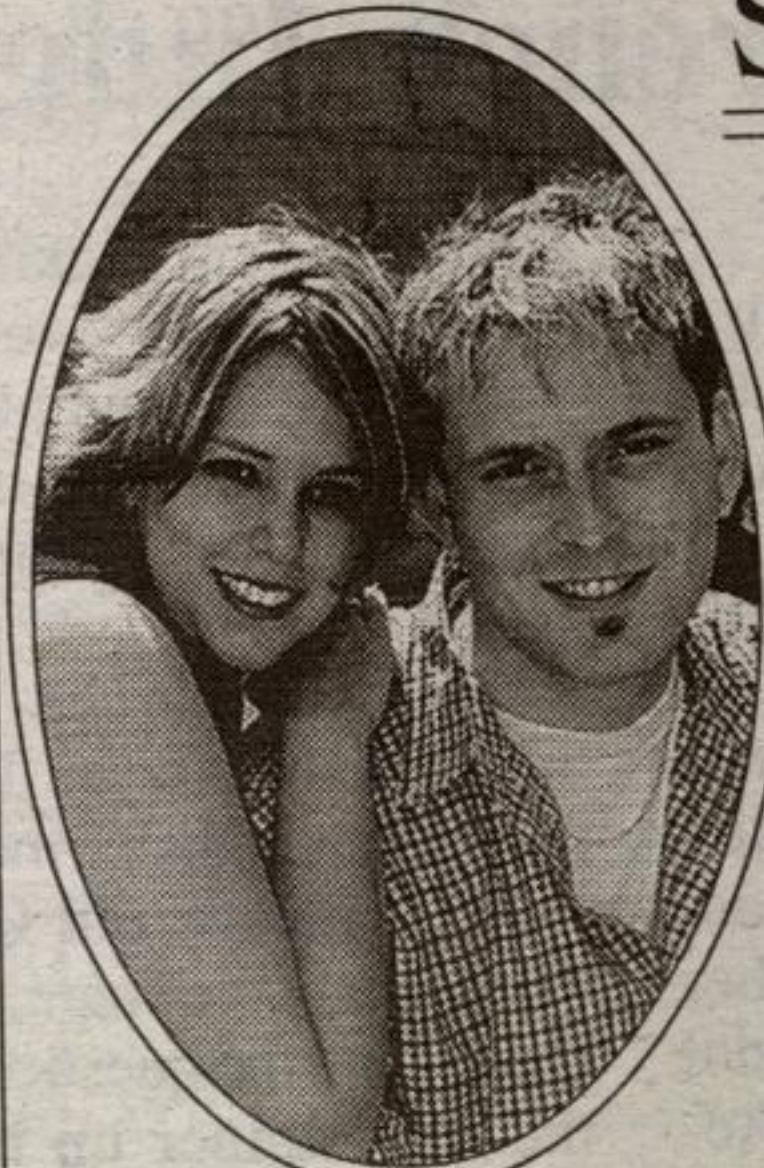
