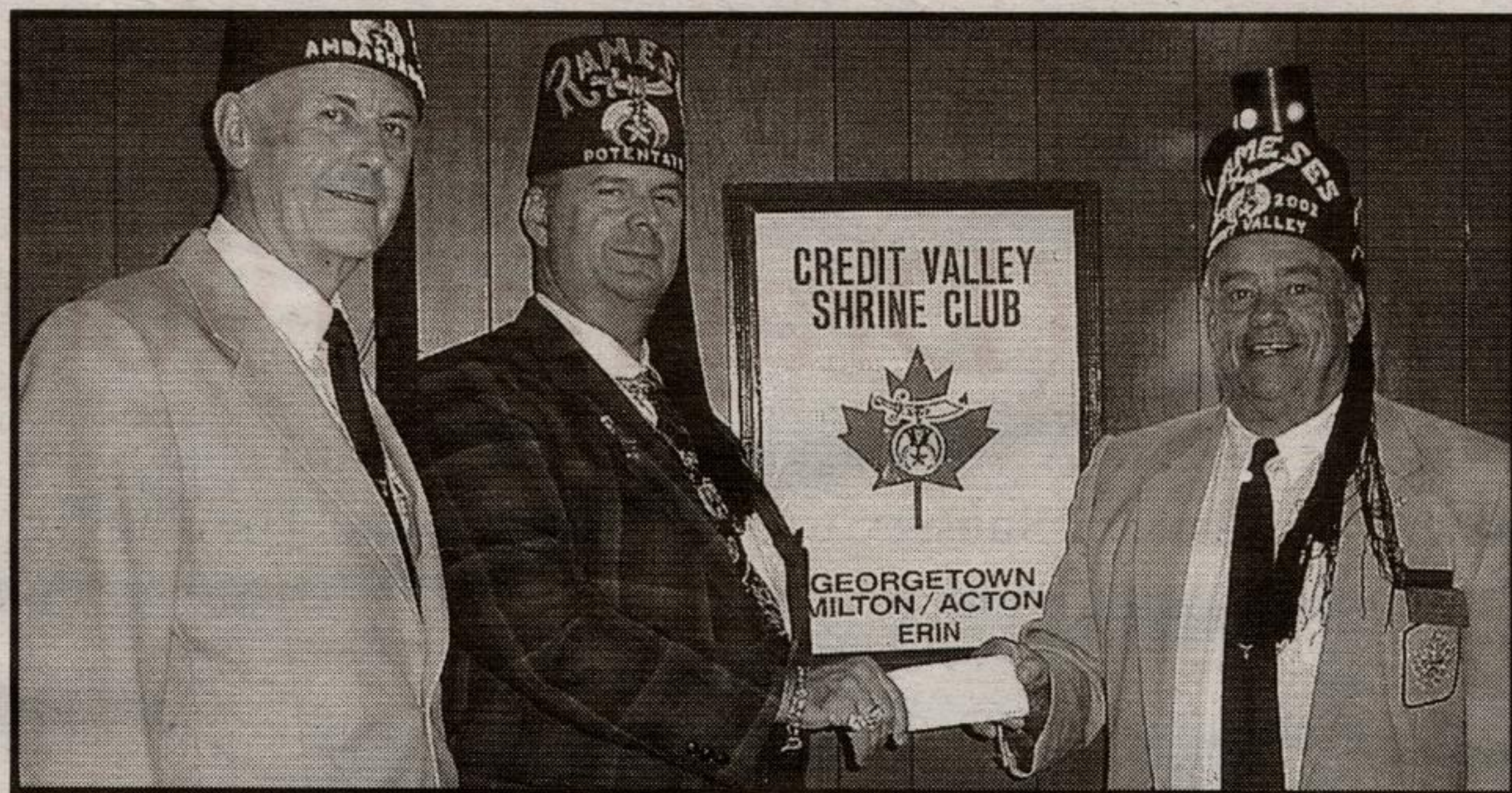

students' needs; and,
• The approach to funding student transportation; including ways to maximize joint busing between boards that serve the same communities.

Following the hearings, the Education Equity Task Force will formulate recommendations, which will be forwarded to Ontario's Minister of Education.

Dr. Rozanski is on schedule to submit its final report to the Minister in November 2002, to support decisions about student-focused funding for the 2003-04 school year.

"Thank you, Acton, for a great year."

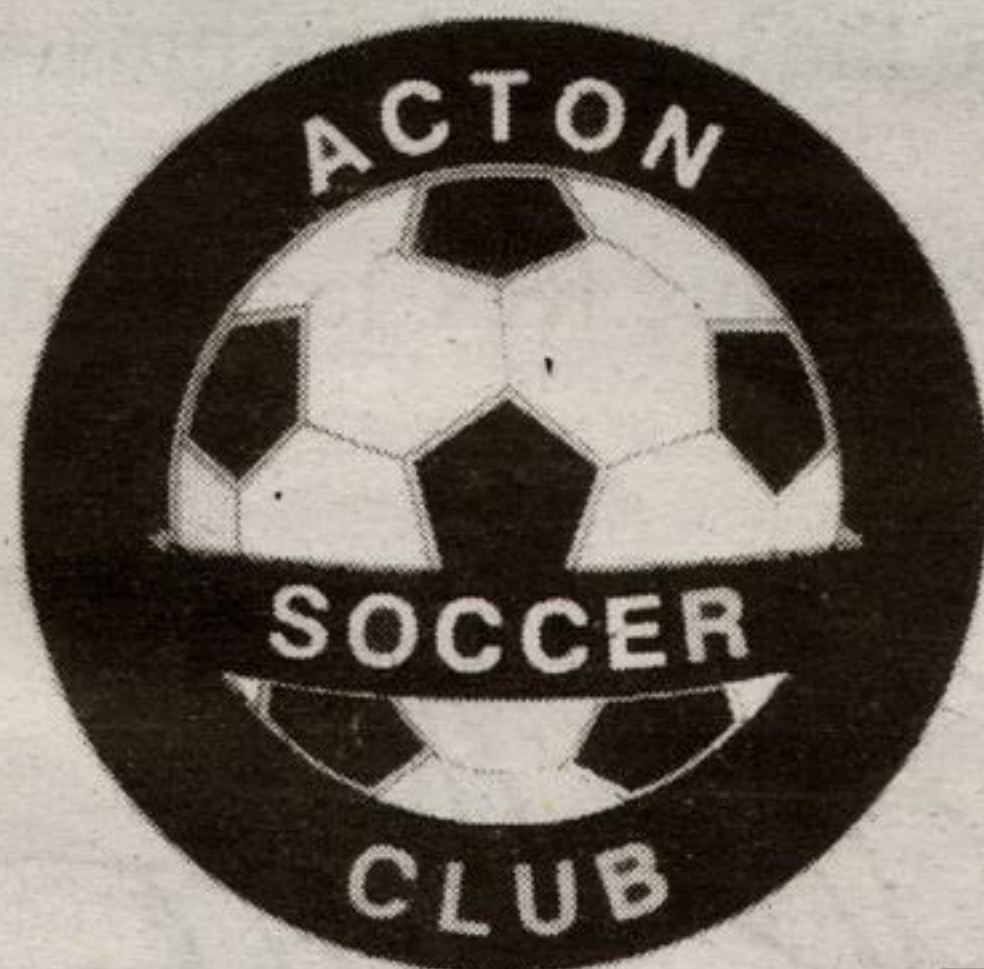
