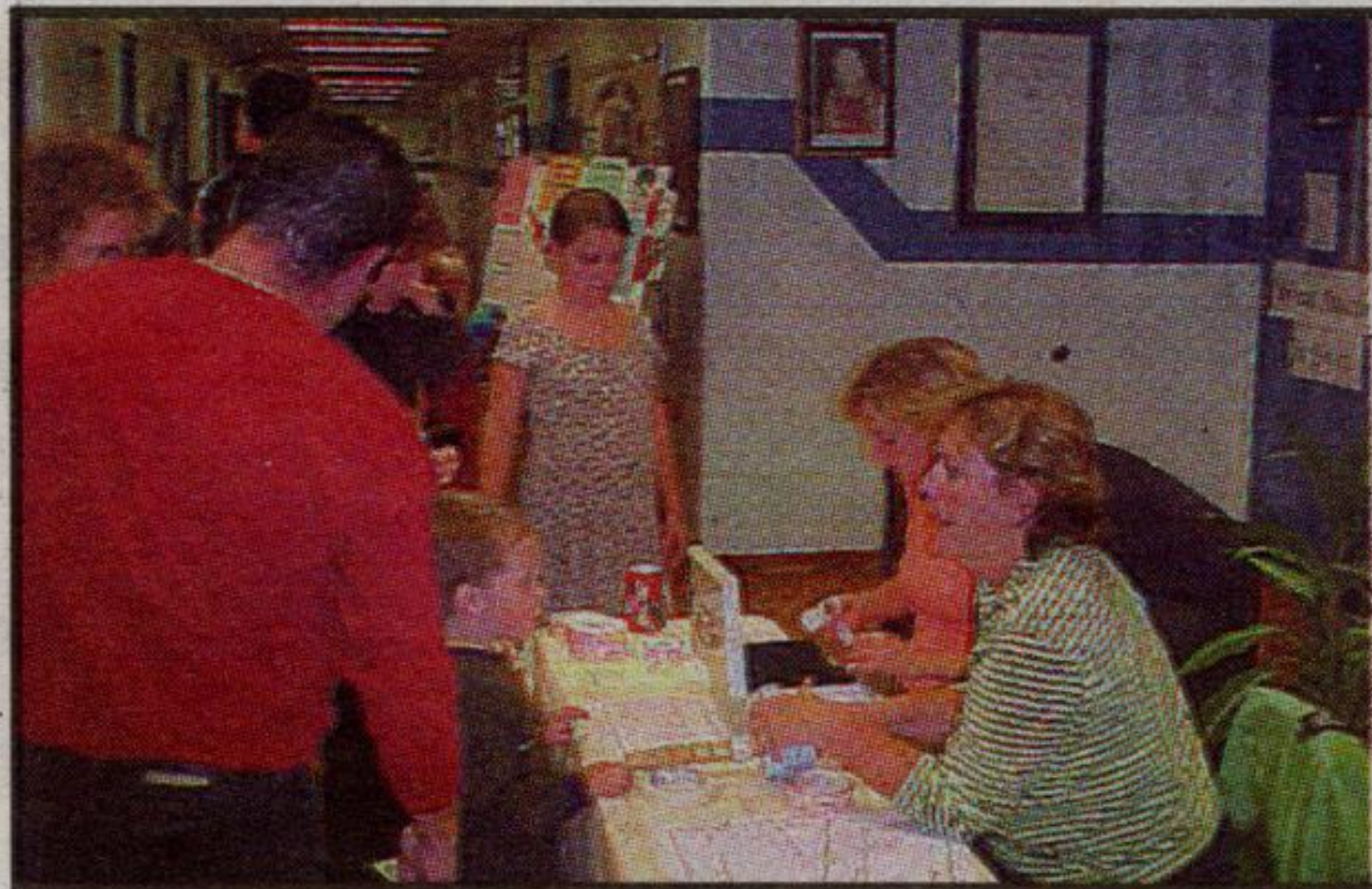
Acton's Atom 1 Team started off the new season on Saturday Sept. 28, hosting the Oakville Rangers, and what a
