




Work on lining Lakeview pipes

Halton works crews continue hooking Lakeview subdivision homes into temporary water bypass lines as the Region fixes water taste problems by lining aging cast iron pipes with epoxy, a \$370,000 job. Initially, only Elmore Drive and Elizabeth Drive were included in the project, but now the entire neighbourhood, with 2,000-metres of watermains, will be cleaned and coated with a new lining, extending pipe life by 20 to 30 years.

Construction should be complete by December 9 when Halton will monitor and test the water to ensure it meets Ministry of Environment requirements.

Charged with five offences

The Acton owner of a pitbull-type dog linked to attacks on local residents is back in Provincial Offences Court in Milton on November 21 for trial.

Rick Kiss is charged with five offences under the Dog Owners Liability Act in connection with incidents allegedly involving his female dog, Lucy, in Acton on February 23, March 15, March 26, May 22 and June 4 this

The attacks led to a tougher dog control bylaw in Halton

Kiss is also charged with allowing an unlicenced dog to run at large in connection with the May 22 incident.

He also faces four charges under the provincial Dog Owners Liability Act of failing to exercise reasonable precautions to prevent biting incidents in February, March, May and June.

Kiss is also charged under the Town's Responsible Pet Owners Bylaw with allowing an unlicenced dog to run at

"We asking the courts for a court order for destruction of the dog," Town bylaw enforcement office Ron Stein said recently, adding the dog in question is being held at the Town's animal control offices until the case is resolved.
