Awards ceremony for Volunteers postponed

Volunteering comes naturally to some Acton citizens.

When they received weekend calls notifying them that a provincial ceremony to honour their volunteerism was postponed, they immediately offered to help.

"People in your area show a lot of good will. When we were making the notification calls, they were asking if they could help do some phoning," Ministry of Citizenship spokesperson Nanda Casucci-Byrne said on Tuesday.

She said an "internal scheduling conflict" caused the unfortunate cancellation and recipients will receive notices of the new Friday, Nov. 8 date.

have each donated half-a-century of time and talent to this community are among those who will receive an Ontario Volunteer Service Awards.

Clarence Harding, Arlene Bruce, Doris Duby, Alf Duby and William Mainprize are among 32 local volunteers to be honoured for their role in helping build and maintain Acton as a strong and vibrant town.

As 50-year-plus recipients, Harding, an Acton Agricultural Society member, Bruce and the Dubys, all of Trinity United Church, and Knox Presbyterian Church choir member William Mainprize, will also receive Queen's Golden Jubilee Medals.

Kay Hart and Pat Kentner will be recognized for their 30 years of continuous service to Trinity United Church and Acton Agricultural Society 25-year awardees include Janet Marshall, Brent Marshall and Norm Shea.

Police caution about idling cars

The Halton Regional Police Service is advising people not to leave unoccupied cars with the engine running in their driveways, after a continuing trend that involves thefts of cars in north Oakville.

Police have investigated ongoing thefts of expensive cars taken from driveways in the area of Glenashton Drive and Grand Boulevard in the Iroquois Ridge area of Oakville. This area was the focus of an alert for the same type of thefts back in January 2002, and the trend is continuing.

The types of cars being stolen are described as high-end expensive cars — Mercedes, Lexus, BMW and

Toyota. The cars all had engines running and doors left unlocked as the owner went back into their house. Thefts occur early in the morning, between 7am and 9:15am.

Police are also concerned

upon receiving information today that children are sometimes strapped into car seats in these idling cars. They strongly advise residents to never leave a child in an unattended car.

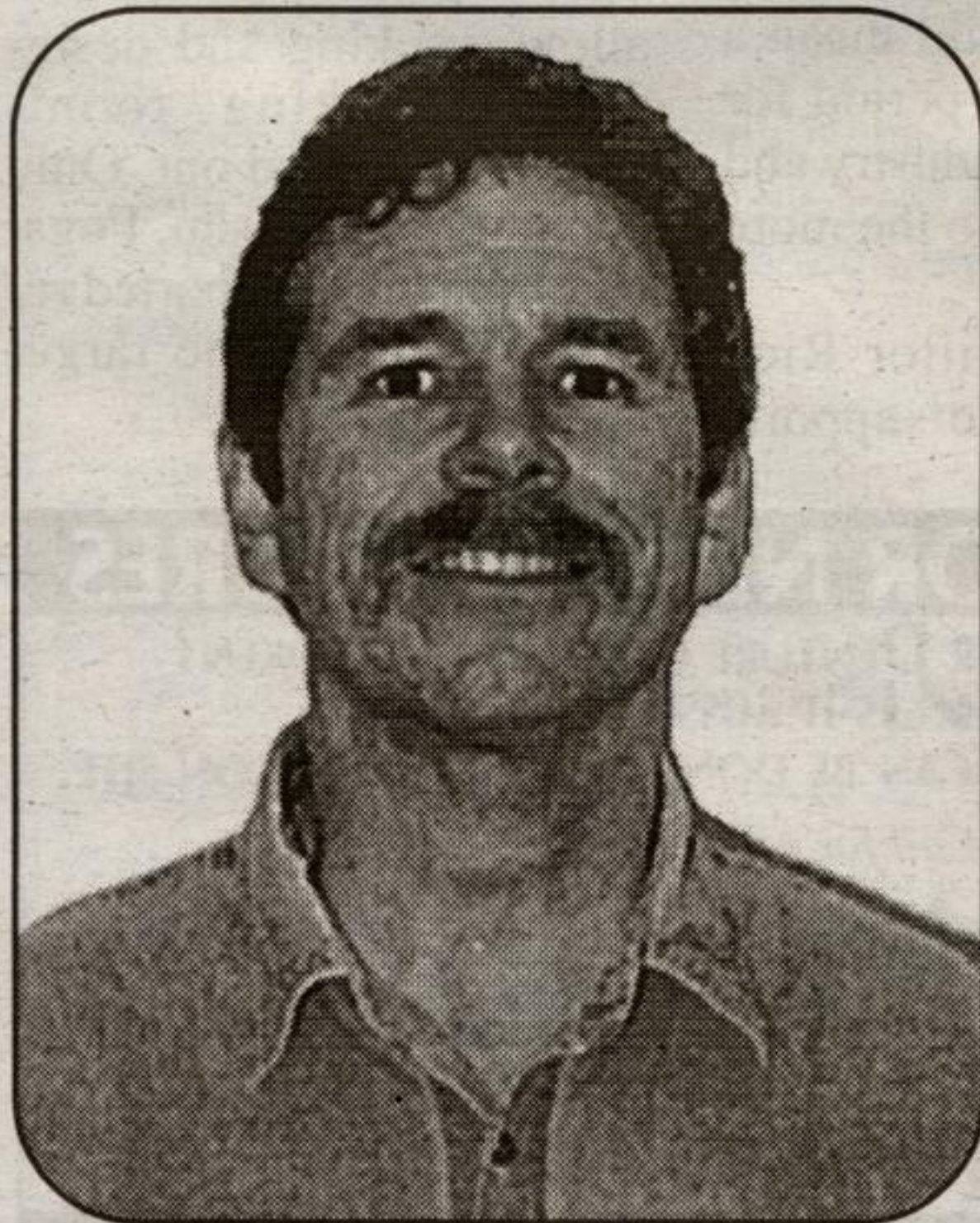



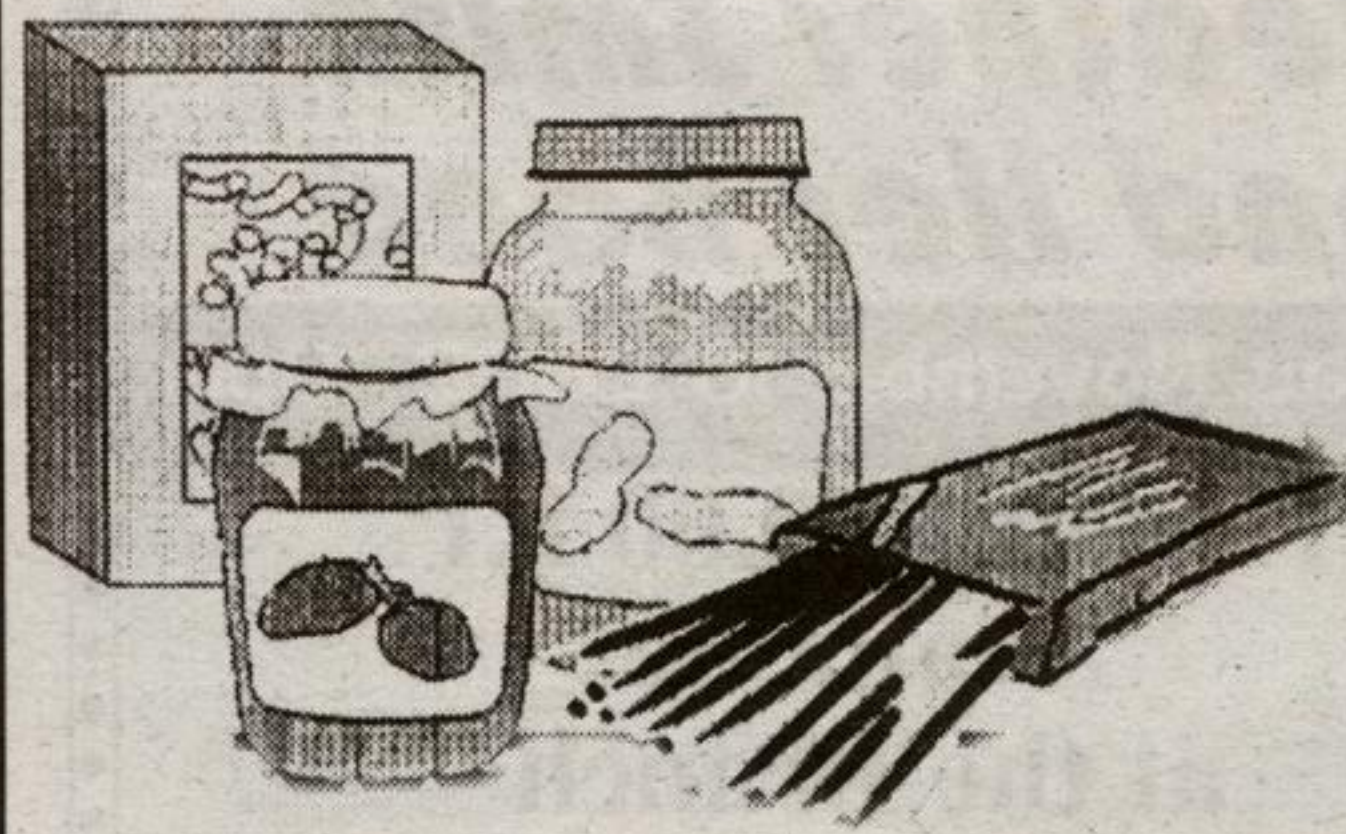
