Tanners PeeWee 'A' team lose to Brampton, Oakville

Acton Tanners PeeWee 'A' team had a tough weekend, losing games on both Saturday and Sunday.

On Saturday, the Tanners came out on the short end of a 5-4 score with Brampton. The Tanners played well and were deserving of a better result but defensive lapses in five on five situations undermined an otherwise solid effort, particularly by the special teams. The power play was three for four on the night. The third power play goal scored by Tyler McNiven on a particularly venomous shot to the short side off of a fine set up by Jessie Kuenzig typified the work of the power play unit all night. The contributions of Riley McGilloway returning from illness and Zack Woolford, perhaps the Tanners most consistent forward so far this season, were also keys to the power play's success.

McGilloway and Woolford scored the Tanners other power play markers with each assisting on the other's goal. McNiven and Dustin Ballentine also picked up power play assists. The Tanners were equally effective when playing a man short, killing all three of Brampton's man advantage situations. Stephen Bennett had perhaps his best game of the season anchoring the defence.

Nik Atiken scored the Tanners' lone even strength goal off an assist by McGilloway, who led the Tanners in scoring on the night with three points. The tally, which gave the Tanners a 1-0 lead early in the second period, was sadly short-lived.

Joss Warren had another fine outing despite taking the loss, stopping 27 of 32 shots and making several big saves to help keep the Tanners close.

Blanked by Oakville

On Sunday the Tanners lost to Oakville 4-0. Two Oakville goals scored in the first 90 seconds of the game put the Tanners into a hole early in the game.

Despite having the better speed and puck-handling ability, the Tanners were unable to find their scoring touch during the match. The power play so brilliant the night before against Brampton struggled against Oakville, especially in the second period when the Tanners were unable to capitalize on a

two-man advantage. Despite the result there were several bright spots for the Tanners, including the work of Nik Atiken, whose speed all game caused trouble for the Oakville defenders.

Colton Burgan was a force in front of the Tanners net against the bigger Oakville forwards. Dirk Vansoelen also had a strong game in goal despite taking the loss, stopping 40 of 44 shots making several key saves in the second period when Oakville threatened to break the game wide open.

Next up for the Tanners is a home game on Sunday, November 3 against Burlington. Game time 12:30pm.
