*Continued from Page 11* dropped between May 25 and July 5, Saunders says. This ensures uniformity of size with the animals in each year for slaughtering purposes. Animals are raised for 2-2.5 years before decisions are made about keeping them for breeding purposes or using them for meat.

Bulls live to about 12 years in captivity, whereas in the wild

they usually die at age six or seven.

Cows can start breeding at 12 to 16 months, but Schatti and Saunders feel it's best to let them hit 2- 2.5 years before they calve the first time. This ensures cow and calf are both healthier. A high quality cow can continue to produce healthy calves to age 17.

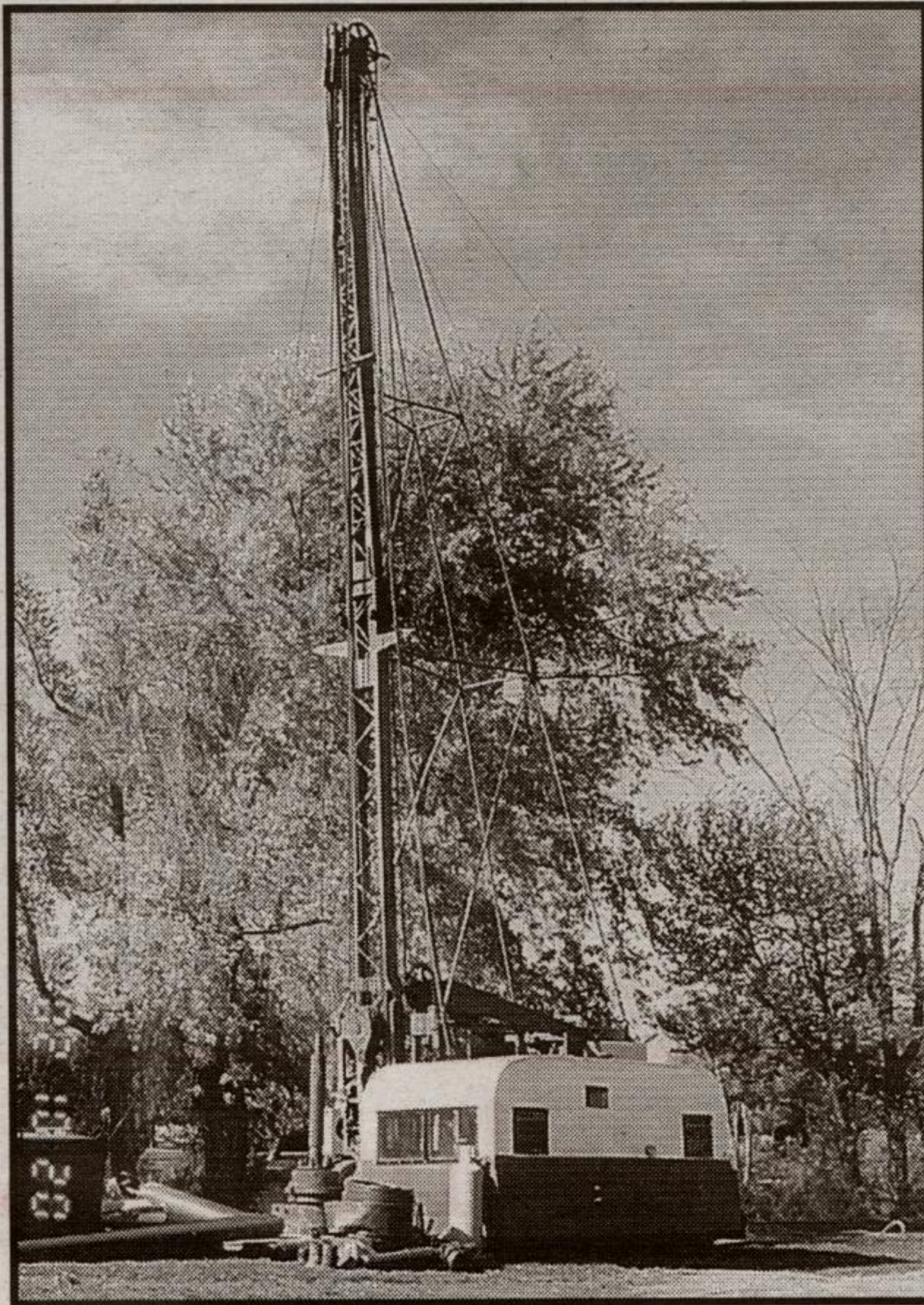

## New well in the park

Drilling of Prospect Park's No. 2 well is a little behind schedule but will still be done before the winter, according to Benson Leung, manager, engineering planning, with the Region of Halton.

The well has been drilled to a depth of 76 feet and they are now at the next stage of the well development procedure, which is basically pumping out the fine material that resulted during construction. Quality testing, which includes biological, chemical and physical analysis of the water, will be carried out over the next few weeks.

The overall purpose of having a second Prospect Park well, says Leung, is to provide a backup to the current existing well in a worse-case scenario situation. "It is essential the region produces a second well in the event of mechanical or electrical failure of the existing one," he notes, "and also to make sure there is enough water for targeted growth".

Halton has a network of 21 wells, which supplies groundwater to about 60,000 people in Acton, Georgetown and Milton. Acton currently has seven wells (three are backup) drawing from the Amabal aquifer in the bedrock valley.

They deliver, on average, 2,732 cubic metres of water a day, with the potential to supply up to 6,732 cubic metres a day.

as it reduces demands on part-time firefighters while still getting the job done.

For example, fewer part-time firefighters will be paged - six, not the current 35 to 45 to low hazard calls like carbon monoxide alarm activations.

Town Council recently approved a three-level fire response plan with a duty crew, duty company and full response, a system Fire Chief Bob Meads said drew mixed reviews in fire halls, with

some firefighters not wanting anything to do with it and others thinking it's great.

"But, overall, I think the majority of guys are looking forward to it," Meads said, adding "money" is the big issue with those opposed to the plan, because they will receive fewer pages and less of an honorarium from the Town.

Meads said testing of a new paging system is complete and the new response system will be implemented within weeks.
