Acton couple is honoured

Two residents of Acton, were among three Awards of Distinction recipients from Credit Valley Conservation (CVC) at the Norval Outdoor School on November 9.

Bill and Irene McIlveen are long-time members of the Halton-North Peel Field Naturalists Club. The Acton

couple has organized and coordinated numerous scientific surveys and inventories of the natural environment in the Credit Valley Watershed, including the annual Christmas bird count, the Halton Butterfly count and the Halton Hills herpetile (reptile and

amphibian) survey.

The McIlveen's data appears in the Ontario Bird Atlas and the Ontario Tree Atlas. The information enhances the understanding of the population and distribution of plants and animals in the watershed, and enables decisions made about the Credit River's future to be based on sound, scientific research.

Other recipients of the Awards of Distinction were the Credit River Anglers Association and the Willow Park Ecology Centre Steering Committee.

Six Awards of Merit were also handed out including one to Lou Maieron of Erin for his protection of both the groundwater and headwaters of the West Credit River.

Halton Region supports Juno Beach project

In honour of the important role Canadian veterans played in World War II, Regional Council recently approved Halton's support of the Juno Beach Centre Project.

Located on the Normandy Coast in France, the Juno Beach Centre will be the first Canadian memorial museum and information centre in Europe commemorating the role Canadians played in World War II.

The Juno Beach Centre - a project organized by a dedicated group of World War II veterans - will be situated on Courseulles-sur-Mer on the Normandy Coast, overlooking the English Channel at the location where Canadian forces landed on D-Day on June 6, 1944.

Halton is supporting the Juno Beach Centre Project through the Group Memorial Brick Program. The Region has purchased a brick that will be mounted on the walls at one of several kiosks near the entrance. The brick will have the Region's name, logo, and a brief statement
