## Province downloading roads again

Guelph/Eramosa councillors say the province is downloading again and their taxpayers will be picking up the tab. -

Thanks to changes to the Municipal Act, council will no longer have any choice in how it maintains certain roads.

In the new act, the province has classified roads according to the number of vehicles travelling on them each day, and set out minimum standards for their care.

Public Works Manager Larry Van Wyck said most of the Class 1 roads in the municipality are arterial roads that should be looked after by the County but they aren't interested in taking them over so Guelph/ Eramosa will be stuck with the increased care mandated by the new provincial rules.

Using Speedvale Avenue East as an example, Van Wyck said very few township residents live on the road but 12,000 to 15,000 commuters use it daily to get in or out of Guelph. That gives it top priority even though it serves the PHONE: 856-4950

Try our great fish & chips city rather than the township. The County won't contribute to the road's maintenance and neither will the city. Guelph/ Eramosa taxpayers will foot the bill.

Van Wyck said it will be a problem shared by many rural municipalities bordering on cities.

Mayor David Adsett said the common sense approach municipalities used to be able to use with their road maintenance is no longer available to them.

# Council wants Province to create, standard software

Guelph/Eramosa council feels it's time the province created and supported standardized financial softto meet the requirements of municipalities reporting to the province.

Each municipality must now meet a set of performance measures mandated by the province but there is no standard computer program available to report that information.

Faced with questions about where to go to get a

new and updated software program to handle the necessary material, council found they had a problem. One firm was very expensive. Another could only offer an older version of the program and still other suppliers couldn't provide the support if the program developed glitches.

Having a computer programmer develop software for Guelph/Eramosa could well cost more than \$30,000, councillors were told and then it would re-

quire revising over time as the province changed its requirements. Imagine the cost when that is multiplied by all the municipalities in the province. Complicating that, is the fact that each municipality may have different ways of reporting its data so taxpayers trying to compare information from their municipality with that of a neighbouring municipality are comparing apples and oranges, they were told.

Amid mutterings from various members, council has called on the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing to develop the necessary software and provide the technical experts to help municipal staff when necessary.

The resolution will be forwarded to local municipalities, members of provincial parliament and the Association of Municipalities of Ontario for support.
