

1997- Provided council assistance to ensure completion of the Acton Legion Senior's Complex.


1994- Worked in tandem with Acton Councillors Elliott and Rennie to guarantee completion of the Acton Urban Land Use Plan. Today, Acton has an outstanding new plaza and a full, build out of available housing in Acton East. 1992- Convinced Council of need for construction of a new Acton Firehall. Most modern fire facility in Halton Hills.

1991- Lobbied successful for establishment of Go Train service for Acton (Later discontinued following Provincial cutbacks)

1987- Actively supported the establishment of state-of-the-art landfill site in Halton Region- only one in G.T.A. Now the envy of most Ontario Municipalities

1985- As Acton's Regional Councillor, argued successfully for the implementation of equalized assessment in Halton Hills, eliminating the previous inequity between Acton and Georgetown.

1984- Assisted in campaign to keep Acton's Hydro Office from closing. Today, Halton Hills Hydro office is located in Acton.
