Outside the council chambers, Hurst said he was looking forward to his new career.

"I'm looking forward to people coming to me with their problems and issues and my being able to direct them to the person that can help them, or by helping them myself," Hurst said, as he posed beside a photo of the 1974-77 inaugural Halton Hills council than included his father, former Acton clerk and councillor, Joe Hurst.

Tackling a possible budget double-digit increase is job one for Acton local councillor elect Mike O'Leary.

Halton chairman Joyce Savoline coasted to another term, handily defeating challengers, three including former Halton Hills politician Rob Heaton who ran a distant second.

Ward One and Two regional candidate Drew Riedstra, making his first try for municipal office, told The New Tanner he found the process "enjoyable informative". "I wish the new council all the best in the next term and hope they will provide progressive leadership." Riedstra is undecided about running again. "I'm thinking it over" he said.


