
Green Peace co-founder at P.O.W.E.R. annual general meeting

Protect Our Water and Environmental Resources (P.O.W.E.R.), the group that initiated the fight to stop a dump planned for the Acton Quarry 15 years ago, is still alive and well. More recently they have been known for TREES 2000 which started as a Millennium project and developed into the ongoing Future Forests.

The very successful ecological restoration project, Future Forests, has provided over 6000 student day trips since the spring of 2000. Half the day is spent planting and erecting bird boxes and half the day is spent on environmental education.

Cops want more cash

Just how much are Halton taxpayers willing to pay to be safe? That's the question raised by a number of members of the Halton Regional Police Services Board during budget debates last week, as the Board approved a \$70million budget for next year, up 13.4 per cent from last year.

That works out to a \$168 increase for the average resident for a policing bill per household of \$473, an everincreasing cost that some Board members feel the public will question.

Police Chief Ean Algar said being a proactive, not reactive service, incurs costs and that he has little control over areas of the budget including salaries, benefits, capital debt and provincially mandated standards.
