A St. Thomas power play goal with two seconds left in the second and a game tying goal with 38 seconds in the third denied the Tanners a sweep of their round robin games. The defence shone in a game in which the home side looking to take advantage of local officiating tried to intimidate the Tanners. However, anchored by veterans McNabb and Hofland as well as newcomers, Tysoe, David Elop and Robertson, the Tanners defence was resolute in its commitment to defending the Tanners goal. When


there was a breakdown Jason Shaw was there to provide outstanding goal keeping. His stop on a point blank shot early in the first period may have been the save of the tournament.



Warren made two saves in succession but was unable to make the third after a breakdown in the Tanners end.


