## Christmas, Boxing Day sales exceed expectations

Much better than anticipated holiday sales brought huge smiles to the faces of most Acton merchants surveyed after the Christmas and Boxing Day rush.

Pre-Christmas sales were beyond all expectations at the Giant Tiger store in the old IGA plaza, where manager Alec Boyd said there was a lot of last minute shopping all day on December 24.

On Saturday, Boyd said there wasn't a "hot" toy this year, but they had great sales in models, crafts, games and clothing.

"Compared to what we estimated, it (Christmas shopping) was about 15 per cent more than we estimated," Boyd said, adding even though they are expected to "over achieve" in sales at a new store, everyone is smiling at the Acton numbers.

Shena Masroor, manager of Bargains Bazaar in the Main and Mill Street plaza, sounded one sour note, reporting the worst sales in five years.

"We were down since last year almost 30 per cent," Masroor said on Saturday, blaming lagging sales on her new neighbour, Giant Tiger, and the fact they didn't have a full inventory because the downtown store

will close before February when the lease expires.

Masroor said sales at the newer store in the Acton East plaza were "all right" this holiday shopping season.

At Forever Youngsters, the upscale children's clothing store on Mill Street, owner Angie Zampirri was "thrilled" with the volume of sales.

Zampirri, in her fifth year of business, had her best year ever, with a doubledigit Christmas sales increase over last year.

"I was surprised. I'm extremely happy with the loyalty I've had from my customers for so long," Zampirri said, adding many of the shoppers that Giant Tiger has brought to downtown Acton are walking and shopping along Mill Street.

Acton resident June Wilson, who was shopping at Forever Youngsters for birthday gifts for three great-grandchildren, said she always tries to shop in her hometown.

"I love this lady," Wilson said looking at Zampirri, continued on page 2
