

APPOINTMENTS TO VARIOUS BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

Interested citizens are invited to apply for positions on various boards and committees.

INTERESTED

- all positions are for a term to expire in December 2006
- must be 18 years of age and resident of the Town of Halton Hills
- must not be a Town of Halton Hills employee
- unless otherwise specified, all positions are volunteer
- meetings generally occur in the evenings

THE COMMITTEES

Committee of Adjustment

- consists of five (5) citizen members
- meets once or twice per month
- remuneration of \$75 per meeting
- to act as a decision-making body which considers applications for minor variances to the Town's Zoning By-laws and applications to sever parcels of land.

Heritage Halton Hills

- consists of eleven (11) citizen members
- regular monthly meetings
- to act as an advisory body respecting the designation of buildings of historical and architectural interest under the Ontario Heritage Act.

Halton Hills Library Board

- consists of eight (8) citizen members
- must be a Canadian citizen
- must not be a Town of Halton Hills, or Library Board employee
- regular monthly meetings
- to act as a decision-making body to set policy for the management, regulation and control of the Library

Halton Hills Senior Advisory Committee

- consists of eight (8) citizen members
- to act as an advisory committee to Halton Hills Council with respect to matters that have a direct impact on senior citizens within the Town.

Litter Free Task Force Committee

- consists of four (4) citizen members
- to act as an advisory committee in respect to the implementation of a comprehensive townwide strategy for reducing litter.

Property Standards Committee

- consists of three (3) citizen members
- meets on an as-needed basis
- to act as a decision-making body to hear appeals by property owners regarding Orders to Comply issued under the Town's Property Standards By-law.

Site Alteration Committee

- consists of two (2) citizen members
- meets on an as-needed basis
- to act as a decision-making body to hear concerns from Halton Hills residents regarding issues under the Town's By-Law Number 01-076 to Prohibit or Regulate Site Alterations within the Town of Halton Hills.

Town Environmental Advisory Committee

- consists of thirteen (13) citizen members
- to be composed of both individuals who have a professional interest in the field of environmental management and of individuals who have a personal interest in environmental protection
- regular monthly meetings and sub-committee meetings as needed
- to act as an advisory body seeking ways to protect, maintain and enhance the Town's natural environment.

Trails Advisory Committee

- consists of five (5) citizens from the business, industry, education, and recreation sector
- to act as an advisory committee to provide advice and input to the Town of Halton Hills on matters relating to the design, construction and funding of a trails system.

Vandalism Task Force Committee

- consists of two (2) citizen members
- to act as an advisory committee to create awareness of the vandalism central complaints registry and to develop public educational and promotional material in cooperation with Crime Stoppers.

Mayor appeals for helps for Raymond Getty's family

Halton Hills Mayor Rick Bonnette is appealing to local citizens and businesses for donations to help the Getty family of Acton pay for their son's funeral.

Bonnette said Halton Hills and particularly Acton, are "gripped in sadness" following the tragic murder of 15-year old Raymond Getty, who died of a gunshot wound to chest last Wednesday while visiting a Danville Avenue house.

At council on Monday, Bonnette offered condolences to the family of the slain boy; a family Bonnette said faces serious

financial constraints.

"I appeal to the community- if anyone has a few extra dollars, and I know it's a very difficult time after the holidays to have any spare money-but if you do, I ask that you please donate to the Raymond Getty trust fund," Bonnette said.

Donations can be made at Scotia Bank, using transit number 70102 and account 0188522.

Ernest Arsenault, a former Getty neighbour who set up the trust fund, is overwhelming with the response from a caring community.

"It is touching that so many people care," Arsenault said on Tuesday, adding that more than \$1,200 was deposited in the trust fund in the first 24 hours, and tellers at the Mill Street Scotiabank branch were "very busy" taking

donations on Monday.

Arsenault said knowing the family's tough financial situation, and not able to pay for the funeral himself, he thought the least he could do was arrange for donations. On December 17, Manny's Roadhouse on Mill Street is hosting a benefit for the Getty family.

With a minimum donation of \$10 at the door, the event will feature live entertainment from Heavy Inc., a band that is donating its time.

"We're going to donate some money ourselves," said Nick Propopapas, father of restaurant owner, Manny Propopapas.

Nick Propopapas said he remembers serving Raymond Getty breakfast at his former Four Seasons' Restaurant, and that his mother and stepfather frequent Manny's.

"We are a family business that wants to help another family," Nick Propopapas said.

Manny Propopapas said downtown businesses have donated items for door and raffle prizes, and they are looking for additional donations and volunteers.
