
## Seniors' jewellery scam artist target

Schemes to dupe seniors out of money have now been joined by another scam aimed at their jewellery.

An incident in Burlington on Jan. 4 where a man knocked at the door of a 75year-old woman in a seniors' residence and asked if she wanted her rings appraised, has Halton police alarmed. They're urging residents, particularly those in seniors' residences, to be "cautious of unknown persons attending their home posing as service or salespersons."

In Burlington the woman gave a male suspect four custom-made rings worth approximately \$45,000 to appraise. He told her he would return in a short time with her jewellery and left. He also got a small quantity of cash and a credit card from the woman's apartment.

When the man failed to return after several hours the woman contacted police and learned she had been duped. The suspect is described as a white, well-dressed male, 45-50 years old.
