Garth Tanner's hat in Tory ring

Well-known broadcaster, author, speaker, and entrepreneur Garth Turner is back in federal politics, declaring his intention to seek the nomination for the new Conservative Party in Wellington-Halton Hills.

Second dog bite victim worries about missing dog

The second of three Acton men bitten by a Ger-Shepherd dog, man deemed dangerous and now missing, has a scar to remind him of the dog's vicious attack.

Frederick Street resident Rheal Gosselin read with dread the account in last week's The New Tanner of Acton's Kurt Bowman Gosselin.

Like Bowman, attacked on January 10 as he walked past the owner's home, Gosselin said the dog's attack on him on Thanksgiving was sudden and unexpected.

"I drive a truck for a living and I was sitting on that damn thing (the bite wound) until it healed," Gosselin said on Friday, adding the bite became infected, leaving him with a three-or-four-inch scar.

Gosselin reported the attack to police and the Town after getting no satisfaction from the Sheherd's owners, and questions why the dog was able to attack a third time.

"After the first or second bite, which was me, the dog should have been quarantined and investigated, instantly. Like, what if it had been a pit bull? He would have been gone, or shot, instantly," Gosselin said, adding, "one bite is bad enough," and the owners don't deserve to have a dog.

"I don't want to see the dog come after some little kid," Gosselin said, adding the Town investigation into the attacks moved too slowly.

The first attack occurred in late summer and involved a grandfather, was walking past the Shepherd with a small dog on a lead,

the Shepherd's attack on and a child on a bicycle. The man and child were knocked to the ground when the Shepherd came at the small dog that slipped its leash.

The grandfather required stitches for a bite, and the incident was reported to the Town.

On Tuesday, Halton Hills municipal bylaw enforcement officer Bob Ustrzycki said the German Shepherd was deemed dangerous last Thursday, and anyone who sees it should call Animal Control at 905-877-6235. The young dog has been missing since the last attack, thwarting Halton health department efforts to impose a mandatory 10-day quarantine because of the bite.

Ustrzycki said the police and the Humane Society are aware the dangerous dog is missing.

"We can't do anything else, than that," he said, adding The New Tanner story notified the public about the dog and the Town would not be making any notice "at this time."

Under the Town's Responsible Pet Owners bylaw, the dangerous dog designation includes a number of conditions for the dog, including a muzzle and secure pen, and obedience training and adequate public liability insurance for the owner.
