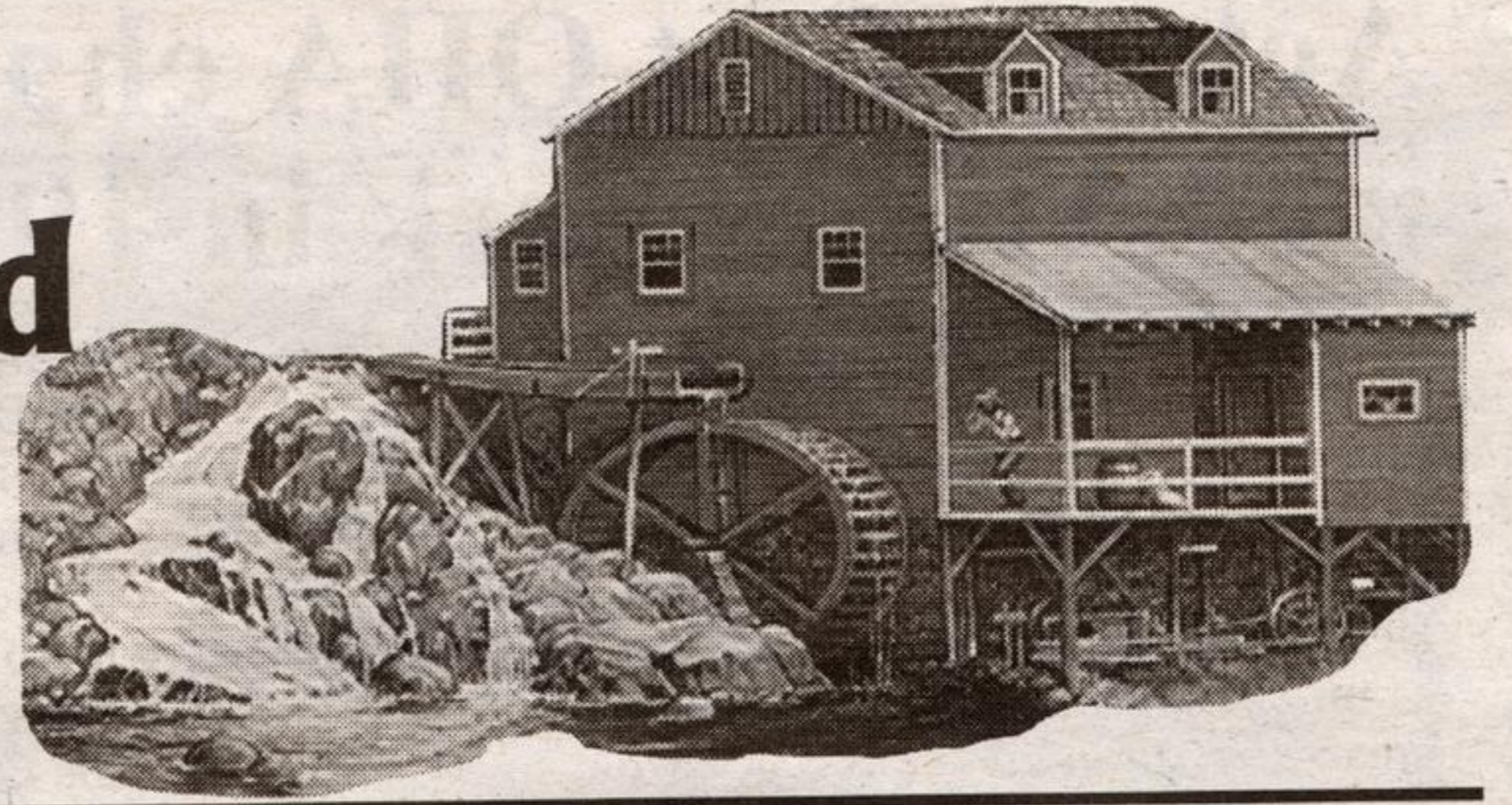
Need old uniforms

Eden Mills History Day Sunday

The Eden Mills Historical Society welcomes people to come to the Community Hall on Sunday February 22 from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. for the second Eden Mills History Day.

Local people, organizations and churches will be displaying old photos and historical documents. Displays will include historical archives from Edgewood

Camp, Eden Mills Presbyterian Church, Eden Mills United Church, Eden Mills Brownies and Guides, and Guelph-Eramosa Township LACAC, among others.

Families and individuals will be on hand to share photos and conversation about years gone by. Wilda MacDougall, former correspondent with the Acton Free Press, will be on hand with her collection of newspaper clippings of Eden Mills events and personal stories over the years.

Barb Marshall, chair of the Historical Society feels very passionate about local history. "It is very important to bring those old photos, letters and other interesting items out of the attic and share them with others, especially children," says Barb.

Marshall's great-great grandmother, Rachel (Cleaver) Ramsey (wife of John Ramsey) was the first

white woman to settle in Wellington County. The story of the Ramsey brother settlers is featured in Deborah Quaille's new book *Rockwood: A Mosaic of Memories* (2003).

Marshall recalls, "My grandfather, Norman Scott Marshall, who owned Marshall's General Store in Eden Mills for over 40 years, instilled a deep sense of pride in the family and local history." The Marshall family will be on hand with a table of old photos and memorabilia.

Light refreshment will be offered and a donation of \$2.00 towards the programs and services of the Eden Mills and District Community Club would be appreciated. Anyone with historical photographs, information or objects from Eden Mills and area to share are welcome to come out and display them.

Wellington OPP Report

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

ERIN CRASH

On Feb. 10 at 5:26 p.m. Wellington OPP responded to a report of a head-on collision on Wellington Country Road 24 near Erin Township Sideroad 10. The collision occurred when a van struck a pickup truck head-on. Paramedics transported the van driver to Georgetown hos-

pital where she was treated for non-life threatening injuries. She had been drinking.

A 44-year-old Hanover woman was arrested and faces charges.

Speeder of the Week

Feb. 12 Const. Steven Hunter of the Guelph Detachment of the Wellington OPP was southbound on Highway 7 in Eramosa on routine patrol. As the officer crested the hill near the 7th Line, he observed a pick-up coming directly towards him in his lane at a high rate of speed.

The officer activated his moving radar and the vehicle entered the beam and recorded a speed of 147-km/h in a posted 80km/h zone. The vehicle returned to the northbound lane and when it passed him, the officer observed a van travelling at a high rate of speed. The officer activated his moving radar and the vehicle entered the beam and recorded a speed of 143-km/h in a posted 80 km/h zone. The officer turned around and stopped both vehicles.

The 17-year-old Rockwood man driving the truck and the 17-year-old Campbellville woman driving the van were both charged with speeding and are scheduled to appear in Guelph's Provincial Offences Act Court on March 8.

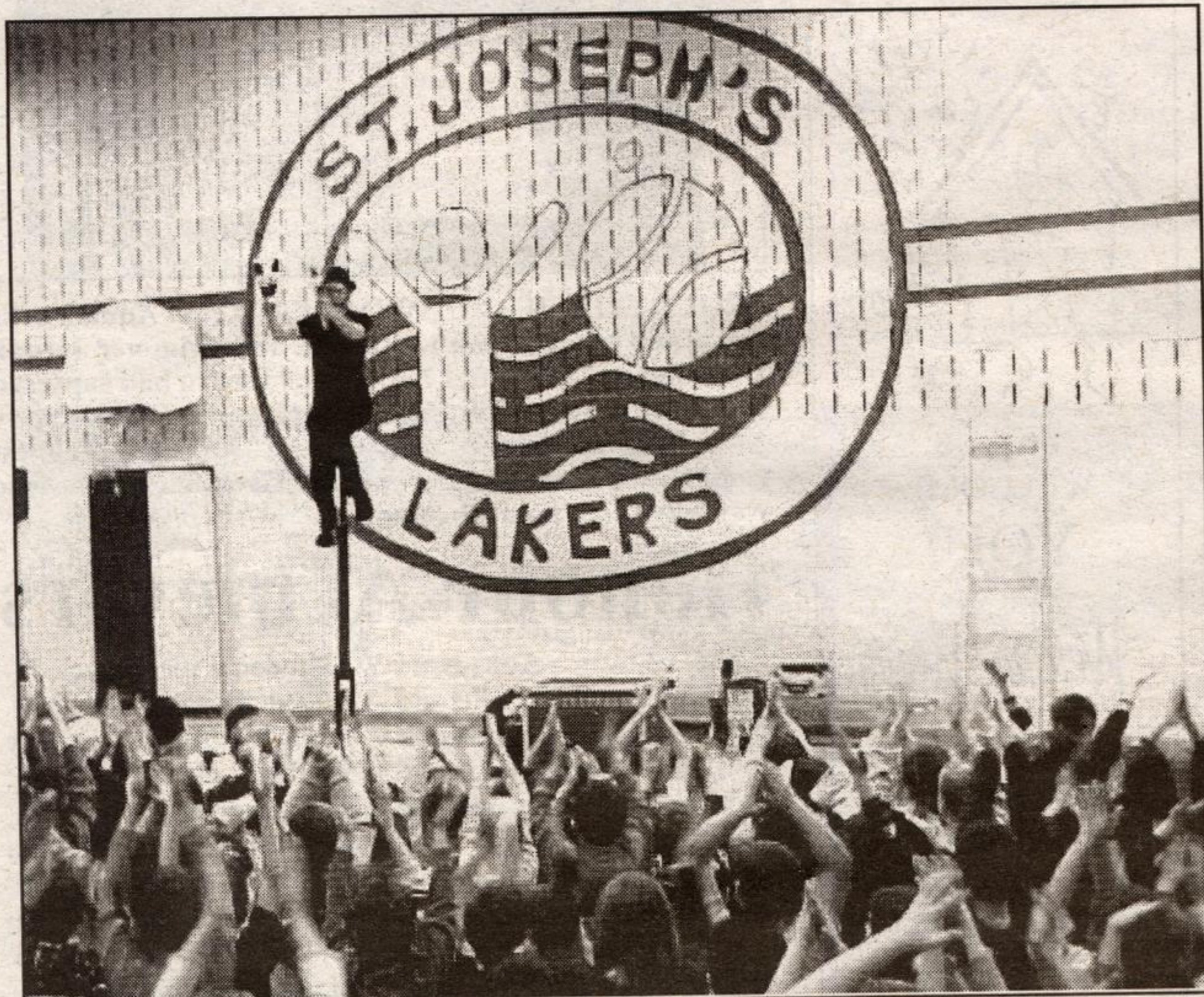
