could not get the equalizer.

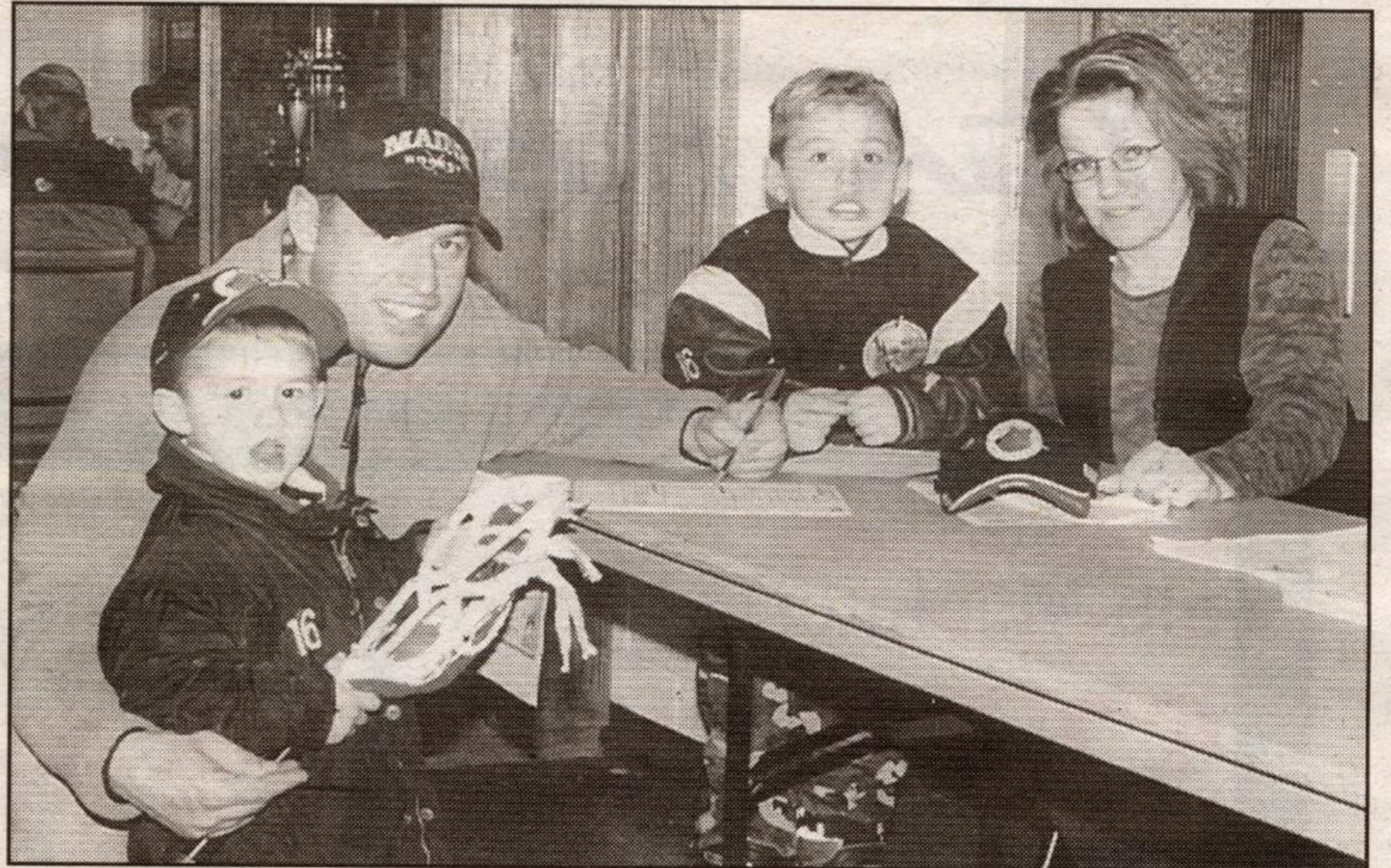

Now that we have Snow

I would like to remind vehicle owners that Town Bylaw #84-1 prohibits parking 2:00 am. to 7:00 am. (Daily) until April 15th (The Bylaw also prohibits parking on any Town or Regional Road for longer than 3 consecutive hours, at a single location) unless otherwise specifically signed.

Now that we have snow, please remember that; on-street parking contributes to an increase in motor vehicle collisions, and fail-to-remain accidents.

It also hinders snow removal and road maintenance operations.

The Bylaw applies to all streets in Acton unless authorized signs indicating otherwise are specifically posted.

Both Police and Bylaw Enforcement Officers will be enforcing the Bylaw. Your vehicle may be ticketed or towed. Either way, it's going to cost you time and money if you choose to disobey the Bylaw.

Take the time to park your vehicle safely, off the roadway.
