Halton Hills named Green St. community

Halton Hills is one of 36 Canadian municipalities to be named one of Green Street Canada Communities 2004.

Green Streets Canada is the country's self-described largest municipal urban forestry program. It has assigned a \$20,000 grant for the participation of the Georgetown Agricultural Society in part of Earth Day events planting trees on road allowances.

Green Streets' objective

is to improve urban forests and provide people with a greater appreciation of the role trees play in the environment and their overall quality of life. The total value of projects in 2004 is \$1,335,902.

Over 280 Canadian communities have been "greened" under the program since 1994. Over \$10 million in total funding has been committed to municipal trees and forests.

transition and for unknown reasons attacked the male escorting officer.
