Approve 17 lot subdivision in Crewson Corners

Wellington County Council has approved a vastly downsized rural estate subdivision; just over the eastern Halton Hills boundary in Crewsons Corners.

A 17-lot subdivision, owned by Thomasfield Homes of Guelph, will be built on a 51-hectare property that fronts on the Halton Hills-Erin Town Line and the Eramosa-Erin Town wetlands.

Line. Council expanded the hamlet boundary to allow the subdivision that includes two protected woodlots and a wetland.

The original plan called for 72 lots and the reduction to 17 resolved many issues raised by the pubic and commenting agencies, including traffic safety and impacts on local wells, groundwater and
