

What sureties need to know

Ending your obligations as a surety

You may decide that you are no longer willing or able to supervise the accused person. In this case you have two options;

You may apply to the court personally and ask that you be relieved of your responsibilities,

You may come to the court and apply in writing to the court to be relived of your duties. The court will then issue an order for the arrest of the accused person.

• Once the court order is made, the police can arrest the accused person and your obligation will be over.

If you believe the accused person is a threat to your safety you should not attempt to bring the accused person back to court yourself.
