Acton boy found safe and sound

An eight-year-old Acton boy, who spent most of last Thursday morning playing computer games instead of going to school, tearfully apologized to Halton police officers who were searching for him.

The boy's parents reported him missing to police at 11 a.m., approximately 45 minutes after receiving an attendance check phone call from a secretary at McKenzie-Smith Bennett School, where the boy is in Grade 3.

He was found at 12:30 p.m., at Think Tank Computers on Main Street South.

Halton Sergeant Gerry Kelly said there had been a discipline issue earlier in the week at school and the boy didn't want to go back, so after riding his bike around town, he went to the computer store, unaware that 29 officers, including the Tactical Rescue Unit and a mobile command unit, had been summoned to a search staging area at Acton arena.

Kelly said most of those officers arrived in Acton before the boy was found, but some were cancelled en route, when he was found, thanks to the alert wife of an Acton arena employee.

When an arena employee told his wife about the search for the missing boy, the woman recalled seeing a bicycle parked behind a computer store, where police found the boy, who Kelly said was surprised that he had caused such a "big deal," which police let him see first hand.

"We had them bring the boy over to the staging area where we were getting set up to show him that police officers were looking for him and were concerned," Kelly said, adding the boy was upset.

Think Tank Computers owner Ken Rockson said he "grilled" the boy about why he wasn't in school, and the boy "swore blindly he was doing home schooling," Rockson said on Friday, adding it is not unusual for mothers to drop their kids off at the store when they go shopping.
