
## Rockwood Karate Club anticipates bright future

On April 19, Council endorsed the release of a draft of the Town's new Official Plan for public comment. This document is the Town's vision for the future to the year 2021, and complements the six directions in the Town's Strategic

The review has embraced seven objectives with a community-based proach: A twenty year horizon with 5 year updates; a focus on key elements involving environment, quality of life, and the economic potential of the Town; watershed and ecosystems; growth parameter of 60,000 - 70,000 persons; updating and/or consolidation of existing secondary plans; and the introduction of a user-friendly, plain language format, with clear mapping.

A series of support studies preceded the drafting of the Plan, focusing on commercial needs of the Town; the role of the rural area; an evaluation of the Silver Creek Subwatershed area; and urban design elements for planned growth in the urban areas of Acton and Georgetown.

The Land Use Policies are divided into three broad categories: Environment and Open Space, Urban Areas, and the Agricultural/Rural Area. Council has proposed that public comments be received by July 30, 2004. As part of this process the Town will be holding three Public Information Centers in Acton, Georgetown and the rural community prior to the end of June 2004.
