# Three Acton schools lose principals

All three Acton public schools will welcome new principals in September as two top educators, Greg MacPherson at Acton High School and Don Warren at Robert Little School retire, and McKenzie Smith Bennett principal Elsa Stolfi is reassigned to a Milton school.

The elementary and secondary school transfers/appointments/retirement list released by the Halton District School Board on Friday, represents the "best match" between school needs and staff skills and career plans, according to Board spokesperson Marnie Denton.

Denton said 140 teachers and administrators would retire at the end of the month, a "huge turnaround" in staffing, that does have one bright spot.

"We're losing lots of great staff, but it makes it possible to hire staff members – you know – young grads as well as many people returning to work after a few years of experience, and that's really valuable.

Although students and parents begged Don Warren, 55, not to retire, after 31 years in education, the last seven-and-a-half at Robert Little, Warren

said the time had come.

Warren said he became a teacher for the "opportunity for creativity."

At Robert Little, Warren said he is most proud of "the relationship with the community and the involvement of parents in the school...the parents are wonderful here, they do things with such class."

Warren said he was also proud to be involved in developing a safety poster adopted by both the Halton public and Catholic schools boards, erection of a safety fence along the rail line adjacent to the school and refurbishment of 90 feet of gardens at the front of the school. Warren's retirement plans include gardening and travel.

At Acton High School, retiring principal Greg MacPherson said after 33 years he had a sense that his contributions were complete.

MacPherson came to Acton

as principal six years ago, although he took last year off to successfully battle cancer, before returning for a final year.

MacPherson, 55, said he always wanted to teach and have the opportunity to have a positive impact on young people.

"We can all name people that have had a positive impact on us, and I think one of things in teaching is that you realize that you can give some of that back to the kids."

MacPherson plans to do some substitute teaching and administrating for the Halton board, polish his golf game, work on his century home in Flamborough and "see what unfolds."

At press time, Elsa Stolfi, who is transferring from

McKenzie-Smith Bennett School to a Milton elementary school, had not returned calls for an interview.

Bert O'Hearn, a Brampton resident now principal of Pearson High School in Burlington, takes over as principal of Acton High School on September 1, and it's a return to the school for O'Hearn who was vice-principal for four years a decade ago.

O'Hearn said he has a "democratic" style of leadership that draws on the "collective wisdom" of staff and a strong parent advisory council.

He said one of the challenges of administering a small high school is to ensure it offers the breadth of programming that's required by students.

The new principal at McKenzie-Smith Bennett is Demetra Saldaris, currently principal at an Oakville school.

Leona Skanes, currently with the Sudbury school board, has been named as principal at Robert Little School.

#### MORE TURF TALK

At the request of Acton Councillor Mike O'Leary, Council deferred debate on staff plans to reduce grass and weed cuttings in a number of areas to compensate for increased turf management costs at the new Gellert Centre in Georgetown South.

During budget talks, councillors voted not to add more money into the budget to pay for maintenance at Gellert, but to find the \$11,000 within

the existing budget, and to save money by lower maintenance standards in less prominent areas.

At Council last week, O'Leary asked that the staff report be deferred until the June 28 meeting to give councillors time to talk to affected constituents about the service reductions.

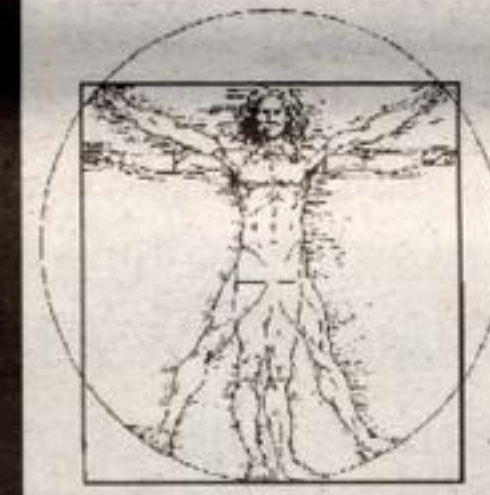
Cost-saving suggestions in Acton include naturalizing – no cutting – in Rotary Park, from Tyler Avenue westerly on the north side of Fairy Lake, and on a substantial area in Sir Donald Mann Park along with rail tracks.

Other Acton changes would include fewer grass cuttings near the storm sewer outlet in Danville Park, along Bovis Creek in front of the library, the natural area on the north side of the creek in Bovis Park and the up to the water's edge in Bovis Park.

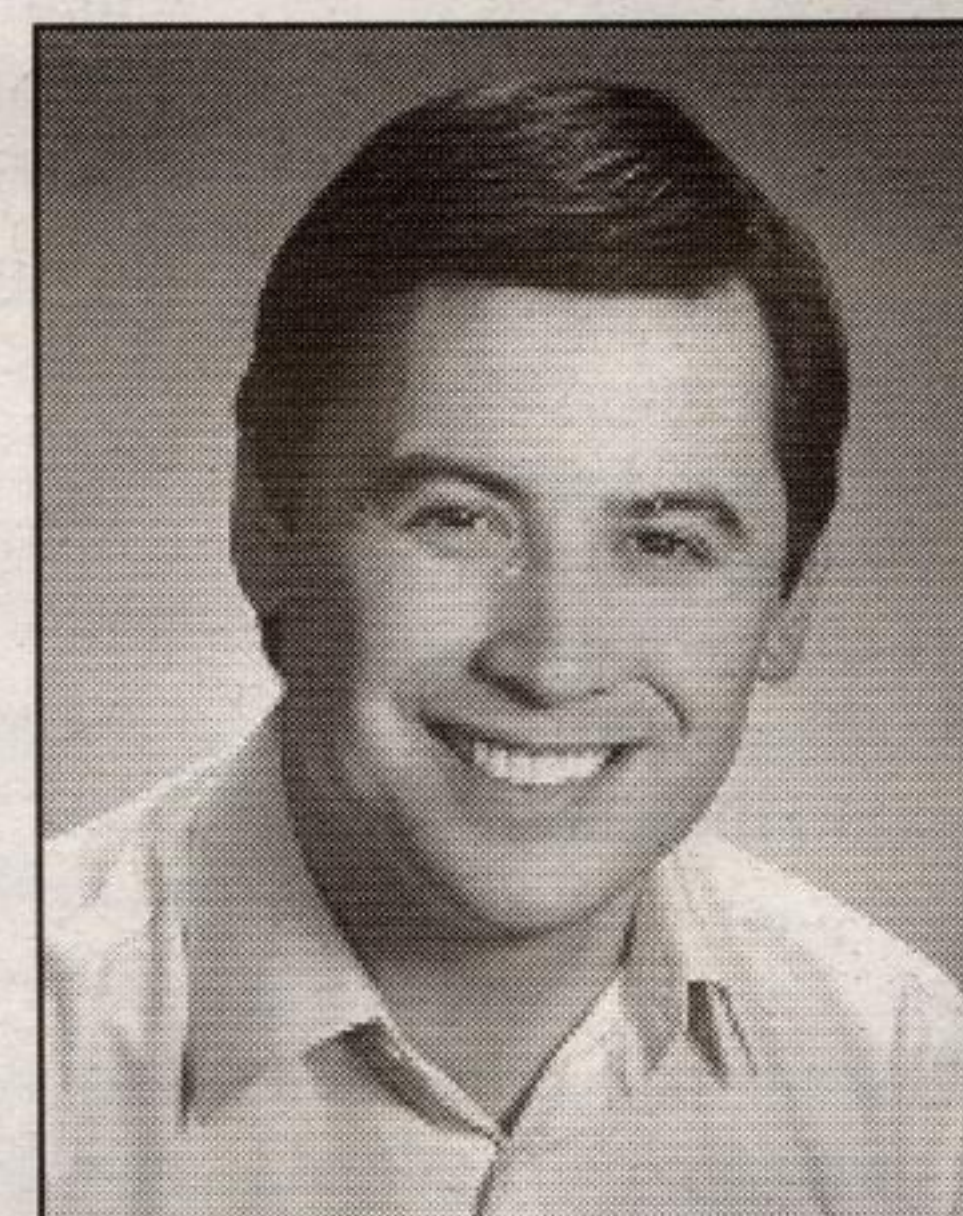
